In recent weeks there has been a great deal of discussion about the content, size, and frequency of our magazine. Bicycle Stamps is the only means the officers of the club have for keeping the members informed about bicycle stamps, covers, cards, cancellations and other related postal material. In addition to being bicycle stamp collectors, many of the club members are enthusiastic cyclists and have broader cycling collecting interests.

The magazine is by far our greatest expense, with postage following in second place. I hope to reduce the cost of membership by reducing the cost of the magazine.

Since all of us are bike stamp collectors, I believe the most important service the magazine can perform is the publication of information about new issues, recent discoveries, and current advertisements and events. Prompt reporting of this information enables the collector to remain up-to-date. Other information is interesting and/or educational and informative, but could usually wait till a later date.

I propose that the next 4 issues of BS (my elected term of office) be reduced in size to allow inclusion of all current philatelic material and whatever other non-philatelic material that will fit, without an increase in postage for that issue, using the rate to Europe as the standard. This should provide all of the information that is available to the bicycle stamp collector and some of the information that is available for the collector of those other bits and pieces of bicycle memorabilia.

All but a half dozen of our members are scheduled to renew between now and November. When you send your check please include the completed questionnaire that is enclosed with this issue. Those renewing in May will also receive the questionnaire. Please return it promptly.
















David Sher, U.S.A. reported the discovery of the Denmark "Ferie" stamps in Scandinavian Revenue Stamps, Volume 2--Denmark, by Peter Paulson. The information found in that volume is as follows.

FERIE (VACATION) STAMPS

Ferie stamps in Denmark were used to provide a holiday allowance to employees. The stamps would be placed in a book, and redeemed by the employer when vacation was to be taken. This FERIE stamp system was introduced on July 1, 1938.

ISSUES OF 1943-1947. The design is of a landscape; a mill, signpost, and bicycle. The designer and engraver are not recorded in the Danish Postmuseum.

Bjorn Rombach, Sweden, has been able to add the following information.

The stamps that where issued this year are supposed to be engraved (?) by Johs. Britze. It is said that the copperplate engraver Oppenheuser made a trial-engraving of a bicycle Ferie-stamp in 1945. This trial-engraving had the value 25 øre. It is not likely that Oppenheusers engraving was used for the later printings of the 1943 25 øres stamp. But the 5 øres stamp from june 1945 is surely engraved by Oppenheuser.

5 øres green has the fabricationnumber F 034

10 øres orange has the fabricationnumber 034, but this is a trialprinting

25 øres blue are without fabricationnumber

1 krona brown are without fabricationnumber

2 kronor red are without fabricationnumber

5 kronor olive-green are without fabricationnumber

The stamps that are without fabricationnumber can exist with f.s.v. if they are reprint made 1945 or later.


5 kronor grey has the fabricationnumber F 040





Europa '90

Most appropriate for Jersey is this year's Europa theme 'Post Offices and Buildings' as 1990 marks the 21st anniversary of Jersey's postal independence.

Since an official Post Office was first established in the Island almost 200 years ago its location has moved a number of times within St. Helier. Four buildings, two past and two present, have been chosen for this commemorative set -

The Main Post Office at Broad Street since 1910 and the current Postal Headquarters at Mont Millais feature on the 18p values, whilst the nineteenth century is represented by Hue Street and Halkett Place depicted on the 24p values.

Technical Details: Stamps designed by Peter Layton and printed in five colour offset lithography by Cartor SA, Normandy in sheets of twenty. Die size 28.00mm × 42.00mm. Set value 84p. Date of issue: 13th March, 1990.

CYCLING - 80c STAMP

Gold medals were to elude New Zealand cyclists until 1970 when in Edinburgh, New Zealand's only 2 gold medals were claimed by cyclists. Gold was won again in Edmonion and Brisbane, but it was a case of so near and yet so far at Edinburgh in 1986. The cyclists collected silver medals in four events - but gold was just beyond reach.

"VOLTA" Cyclista a Catalunya

First run in 1911, allowing for the intervention of two wars, 1989 marked the 69th "VOLTA" Cyclista a Catalunya bicycle ride, and marked the issuance of the 14th set of vignettes commemorating the ride.

Nothing is known by the author of the 1911, 1913, or 1955 issues. The 1912 vignettes are known to have been issued in red, green, and magenta. Issues for 1980 - 1989 were issued both perf and imperf in sheets of 4 similar to the 1988 pictured here.

Of no philatelic value, these vignettes nevertheless make interesting additions to the bike stamp collection.



Bicycling has become a major sport in much of the world. Ever since 1931, when Bulgaria included bicycling in a set of stamps publicizing the Balkan Games, national bicycle races have been publicized and funded through the sale of postage stamps. These have included stamps for the Tour de France, Giro d'Italia, World Cycling Championship Race, and others.

Through the kindness of BSC member Shiro Yagami, Japan, there follows a list of the World Bicycling Championship Race locales.

Including the two issued in 1951 there have been 24 issued to date.
