Will auf ihre Ära auch die Philatelie einen Rückblick bieten, soll sie diesen Anlass nicht verpassen. In diesem und den nächsten 3 Jahren (bis 2002) haben Sie die einmalige Gelegenheit, Ihrer Sammlung einen kostbaren 100-Jahr-Review hinzuzufügen. Wir reisen Jules Verne hinterher, durch das 20. Jahrhundert in 80 Briefmarken. Am Ende der Tour erscheint für die ganze Kollektion ein Buch. Anhand von Briefmarken können Sie Ihren Kindern und Enkelkindern dann über unsere bewegten 100 Jahre erzählen.

Unsere Auswahl aus der Vielzahl markanter Menschen und Ereignisse des 20. Jahrhunderts umfasst 8 Gebiete mit jeweils 10 Themen. Jedes Jahr stehen 2 Gebiete auf dem Programm: 1999 "Sport und Freizeit" und "Persönlichkeiten", 2000 "Krieg und Frieden" und "Kunst", 2001 "Technik und Wissenschaft" und "Humanwissenschaften", 2002 "Gesellschaft und Sozialleben" und "Tägliches Leben". Am 6. Dezember erscheinen die ersten 20 Marken, über Höhepunkte des

Sports und der Freizeitkultur sowie Menschen besonderer Prägung. Das Ganze ist weltumfassend gedacht, wobei jedoch Entwicklungen im eigenen Lande und auch die Rolle der Belgier im Ausland nicht aus dem Auge geraten. An die Reihe kommen z.B. die Olympischen Spiele mit Jesse Owens, aber auch die Tour de France mit Eddy Merckx sowie König Baudouin bei Papst Johannes XXIII.

Das bunte Durcheinander an Menschen und Dingen baute der bekannte Désiré Roegiest zu einer harmonischen Gesamtansicht um. Mit dieser Ausgabe verabschiedet sich die Philatelie würdig vom 20. Jahrhundert.

A journey through the 20th century in 80 stamps

With the year 2000 in sight, we think it is an excellent moment not only to look ahead to the next millennium but also to look back at the 20th century that is now drawing to a close.

During the next four years (1999 to 2002) you will be offered the unique opportunity to add a prestigious survey of the 20th century to your collection. Like Jules Verne did more than a century ago (Around the world in 80 days), we will make a journey through the 20th century in 80 postage stamps. This fascinating journey will end with the release of a book depicting all 80 stamps. You can use the book to show your children or grand-children the stamps while telling them the story of our eventful century.

As this special issue salutes a wide variety of people and facts, it will be divided into eight themes (two per year), each theme consisting of ten subjects. These themes are:

"Sports & Leisure" and "Personalities" in 1999;

"Peace & War" and "Art" in 2000:

"Technique & Science" and "Life Science and Social Science" in 2001;

"Society and Social Life" and "Daily Life" in 2002.

The first twenty stamps, featuring major sports events and leisure activities and honouring people who left their mark on the past century, will be issued on St Nicholas's Day. Although this set's values highlight events and people from all over the world (the 1936 Olympic Games with Jesse Owens; Pope John XXIII), attention is also given to the developments in our own country and to the role Belgians have played in the world (King Baudouin; Eddy Merckx, who won five Tours de France).

Désiré Roegiest has succeeded in creating a harmonious ensemble out of this mishmash of people and facts.

With this issue the philatelic world bids a worthy farewell to the 20th century.

This sheet, the stamps of which will not be sold separately, will cost 340 BEF (8.43 EUR).

FAUSTO

Fausto Angelo Coppi was from Castellania. He was a professional cyclist from 1940-1959.

He was one of the most famous champions of all times. He won over 58 races and, in 1949, was the first rider to ever win the Giro d'Italia and Tour de France in the same year. He was just over 20yrs old when he won his first Giro (1940).


World War II, after being drafted into the Armed Forces, he was captured in Africa and didn't return to cycling until 1946, when he won the first of his three Milan-San Remo classics after a breakaway of 147km.

Here are some of his other victories and placings:

World Champion, Lugano 1953 (he was 3rd in 1949).

Tour de France - 1st 1949/52 Giro d'Italia - 1st 1940/47/49/52/53 2nd 1946/55

He was Italian Road Champion in 1942/47/49/55 and was 2nd in 1948/54.

He was an exceptional time trial and pursuit rider. He was World Hour Champion in 1942 when, on Nov 7th on the Vigorelli Velodrome (Milan), he covered 45.798km. He won the Grand Prix de Nations in 1946 & 47 and was 2nd in 51. He was the World Pursuit Champion in 1947 & 49 and 2nd in 1948. In the two-man time trial, Trofeo Angelo Baracchi, he teamed with Filippi to win in 53/54/55; was 2nd in 56 with Filippi, then in 57 won again, but this time with Baldini

He died tragically in January 1960 from malaria which had been diagnosed too late; he had just returned from Upper Volta where he had been taking part in track races and big game hunting.





Two stamps to celebrate the World Cycling Championships Treviso, 27 March 1999.


The Veneto '99 World Road Cycling Championships also involve philately enthusiasts. Two commemorative stamps on the World Championships planned in Treviso and Verona from the 4th to the 10th of October 1999 were issued today by the Republic of San Marino State Mint.

The event's presentation took place this morning at the Treviso Provincial Council's Bruno Morton Hall, in the presence of its President, Luca Zaia, as well as that of the State Mint's President, Corrado Carattoni and of the Managing Director, Marino Zanotti. Representing "Veneto '99", its Managing Director Remo Molose spoke at the ceremony on the importance of this initiative to the sport of cycling and to the World event, an opinion shared by Agostino Omini, International Cycling Union Vice-President, who also participated in the presentation.

"It is with great enthusiasm that the Provincial Council participates in this exceptional event, which is a new experience for Treviso. Not only philatelists," commented Luca Zaia, the Provincial President, "will appreciate the great value of this initiative, which will be remembered not only with respect to philately, but mainly from an historic standpoint, associating the image of the Palazzo dei Trecento building to the Veneto '99 World Road Cycling Championships logo."

It is a great sporting event that sees the Treviso Provincial Council acting in synergy with leading Veneto companies. "The 1999 edition of the World Cycling Championships will attract the attention of all Italian and foreign sports enthusiasts," explained Corrado Carattoni. "It is an event that our Republic, ever mindful of including events of great public interest in its stamp issues, considered very worthy of our commemorations."

Therefore a two-stamp series was created, on which, in addition to the usual inscriptions and the official championship logo, the symbolic elements of the two cities hosting the Championships themselves are depicted: Treviso's Palazzo dei Trecento building and the Verona Arena. "The creation of the two stamps," continued Carattoni, "is the work of Veneto architect, Valerio Pradal (also the Championships' General Co-ordinator), who in the past was responsible for other splendid San Marino philatelic issues."



"For all practical purposes," concluded Marino Zanotti, "they amount to 340,000 miniature posters that will leave San Marino to spread the images of Treviso, Verona, the Veneto region and their World Road Cycling Championships to the entire world. Unlike posters, however, stamps are destined to remain visible long after the event is over, because they populate catalogues that philatelic editors the world over publish yearly. The image is also placed in collections that are displayed in countless national and international exhibitions organised every year." This is a San Marino philatelic event that testifies how San Marino and the Veneto and Emilia-Romagna regions are linked by a strong sports tradition and an authentic passion for cycling.

"This original issue," concluded Luca Zaia," represents an additional instrument for the diffusion and recognition of the area's image in the world and will undoubtedly add more worth to what it has to offer in the terms of tourism, business and culture, representing a suitable setting for the event's global dimensions."

The Republic of San Marino philatelic issues dedicated to the Cycling Championships will not remain an isolated occurrence. The Italian Postal Service is also planning on issuing a stamp, scheduled for release on the 15th of September



In December I attended the Phillips auction in London of the collection of the late Frank Pegley, a BSC member. It was divided into fourteen lots, which realised the amounts shown.

I did not wait for the sale of Lot 433, the Great Britain 1978 9p cycling imperf pair, which was not part of the Pegley collection.

Bidding for these items came mostly from myself and two other people present, with some offers from one or two others and a few postal bids. There was particular interest in Lot 224, which was strong in trade envelopes and went for far above its estimate; indeed, the bidding for it was more frenzied than for most of the 219 preceding lots. There was also keen (but friendly) rivalry for the last two lots, whose purchaser can look forward to many hours of sorting through stamps and covers of relatively low value but of much interest. Though he admitted to already having many of the stamps, there is plenty he was keen to add to his collection.

Some members will know that Frank Pegley displayed his material with success, winning, among other awards, First Prize at Thematica 89 (Britain's Thematic Stamp Exhibition). Some of the smaller lots comprised beautifully presented display pages. While it is always sad to see a top-class collection broken up, there is consolation in the fact that the components were bought by purchasers who appreciated the efforts of Frank and whose enthusiasm for cycling stamps compares with his.

Incidentally, I am familiar with enthusiasm, not to say fanaticism, among collectors, but even I was surprised by that shown by an unsuccessful bidder for Lot 233 who wanted just one item in it – a letter (but no envelope) written on the headed paper of the 25th Battalion of the London Regiment, a cycling unit of the First World War, whose members were turned into foot soldiers and, without their bicycles, sent to India in 1916. The purchaser was happy to hand over the letter for nothing.


100th ANNIVERSARY OF THE BIRTH OF NICHOLAS FRANZ

To commemorate the anniversary, a Philatelic Exhibition was held in Mamer, Luxembourg, from the 4th to 7th November 1999. The exhibition was organised by one of our members, Ralph Letsch, for the Cercle Philatelique de Mamer. Brian Sole and his wife attended and he has written to say that it was a mixture of stamp and postcard displays on the theme of cycling, and many frames, devoted to the life and times of Nic Franz, in the form of newspaper cuttings and old photographs. At the entrance was the bicycle ridden by Nic Franz in the Tour de France.

There were several excellent thematic exhibits on Cycling, including one from Bicycle Stamps member, Emanuel Erbs of New Zealand; one from Portugal, two from Germany and Brian's. On the opening evening, there were illustrated talks, both on the success of Nic Franz as a cyclist, and some of the many cycling stamps and postmarks available. The exhibition was jointly organised by Cercle Philatelique de Mamer and Velo Sport Mamer.

After an interval, a film was shown which had been specially prepared, professionally, incorporating old footage of the many races in which Nic had participated, plus some interviews with him, and still photographs of his family life and trophies he had won. Unfortunately, the commentary of the film (and that of the earlier slide shows) was in German, which Brian does not speak, but it was clear from the slides and films what was happening. Luckily, Ralph Letsch and his parents spoke English and kindly explained some details. There was a prize-giving on the last evening and all participants were given a handsome medal and certificate. A copy of Brian's certificate is shown.

Ralph Letsch is to be congratulated on setting up, with his helpful team, a fine exhibition.



Brian acquired two ephemera items in an auction of revenues and these are shown. The top item is a bicycle licence issued by Latvia in 1939, with details of the bicycle and a 1L General Duty Revenue stamp, with Riga Police cachet. The second item is similar, (with two nasty rust marks from the staples used), but for 1938 and with Kuldiga Police cachet.

- Brian Sole entered his "Go by Cycle" exhibit at the American Topical Association 50th Birthday Celebration in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, over the week of 30th July to 1st August 1999 and was awarded a Gold Medal - congratulations Brian...
- New member, Gordon Drever, is interested in trading duplicates and perhaps new issues any member that has anything of interest can contact Gordon direct.
- The collection of the late Frank Pegley was placed at auction by Phillips of London on December 16th 1999. To my knowledge at least three members attended the auction and at least one other submitted bids for items by mail. Terry Crawford has been kind enough to write a short article covering the auction and you will find this on page 22. Terry was lucky to obtain two of the lots and has since written to say he is having an enjoyable time sorting through them it would appear that Frank had managed to avoid buying complete sets for the sake of one cycling design (unless he had disposed of the other stamps separately), so Terry has been able to reconstruct a few of his broken sets, as well as adding to his collection.
- Martino Saguato has advised that the cyclist shown on the Postal Card "Italy '98 Gold Medal", which appeared on page 10 of BS28, is Michele Bartoli (Mapei), the winner of the 1997/8 World Cup.
- Martino has also asked if anyone has information on the "Syracuse Bicycle Company"; he has
 recently purchased an envelope bearing this Company's name.
- Josef Muhsil has advised that the cyclist shown on the Liechtenstein maxi-card of May 25th 1999 (see BS28 page 17) is Samuel Ritter of Mauren - this information was supplied by Mr. Leo Heeb, Official of the Liechtenstein Philatelic Service. Josef advises that it is only possible to buy complete sets of the maxi-cards.
- Josef also advises that the Belgium Post Office will only complete sheets of stamps of the issue that shows Eddie Merckx (see page 8), as he says "if you are only interested in the Eddie Merckx stamp, you have to take the complete sheet - postage for 19 letters remain..."


DANISH POST & TELE MUSEUM - 28.05.98

Flemming Andreasen has answered my question in "From My Musette" BS27, p29. There are no miniature sheets containing the 8.75K stamp, however, there are 2 different panes in the booklet. Both panes are cut on three sides and perforated at the top. The block of 4 stamps are the same on each pane; the background of one pane is a street scene with at least seven cyclists shown. The street is Köbmagergade in Copenhagen (1923).




The other pane's background is the "Postmen's Decree" of 1624.

The Post & Tele Museum also has a booklet of 10 stamps that have no value and cannot be used for mailing; they are a souvenir only. There is a bicycle against the wall and one in the street on each stamp.






SOME OLD POST CARDS

SHANE KELLY - Special cancel used by the Ararat Post Office. Ararat, the home-town of Shane Kelly, is in Victoria, Australia.

In November 1999 I received a letter from previous stamp club member, Pasquale Polo, who had discovered that such a cancel existed. My first thought was to have this cancel printed on postcards which portrayed Shane Kelly - I managed to obtain some of his publicity cards but there was no area on which a stamp and cancel could be placed.

My next choice was to use an envelope, into which I could place Shane's card - I contacted the Ararat Post Office who were extremely helpful and sent them 20 envelopes with the request that they be postmarked Jan 7, as this was Shane's birthday. They willingly obliged but, when I received the envelopes, I found that the cancel (which is of poor quality) was "lost" on the stamp.

I contacted them again and they agreed to re-run the envelopes and print the cancel on the bottom of the envelope but, as their machine is an automatic device, this imprint is upside-down!!

If you would like one of these envelopes with the slogan cancel and Shane Kelly's card inside, I have a small quantity for sale at \$A6 each (incl. Postage).
