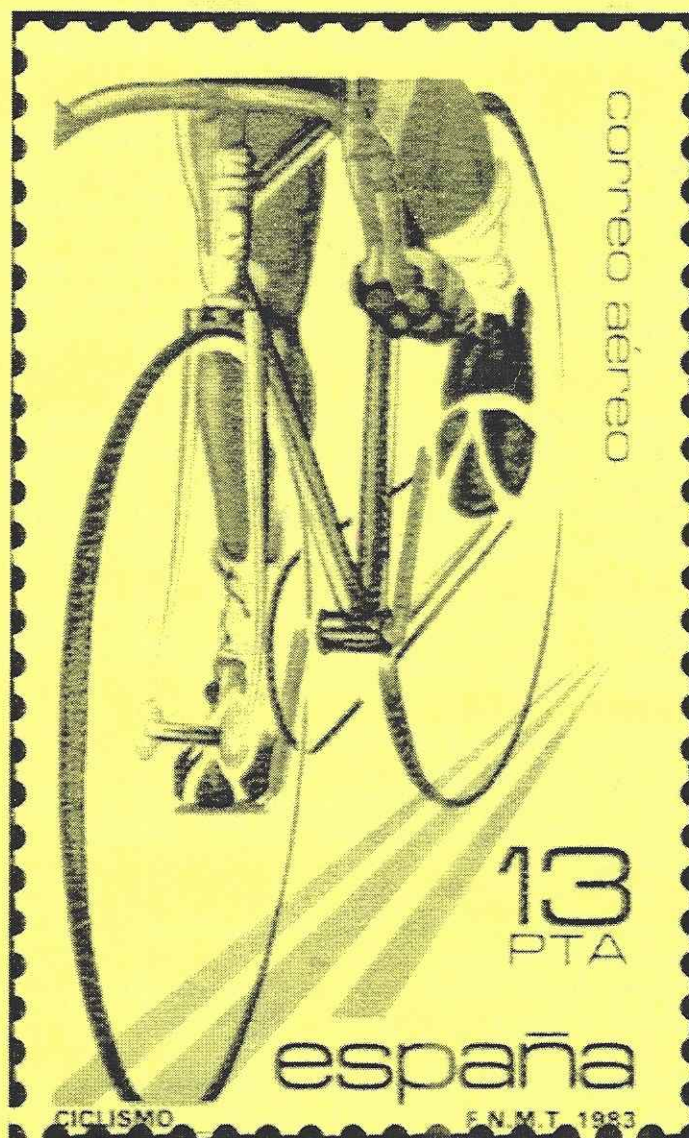

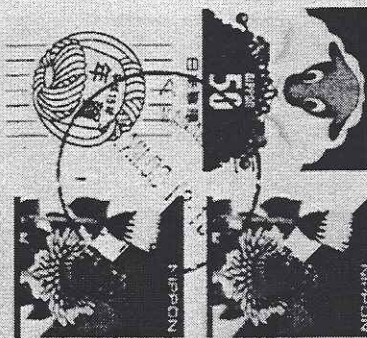

7. **POSTAL CARDS** are those cards that include the stamp or prepaid indicia printed on it. **POST CARDS** need the addition of a stamp for mailing. Only those Post Cards issued by a country's post office are included in this list.

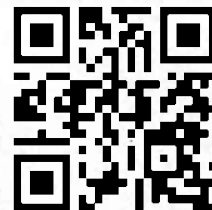

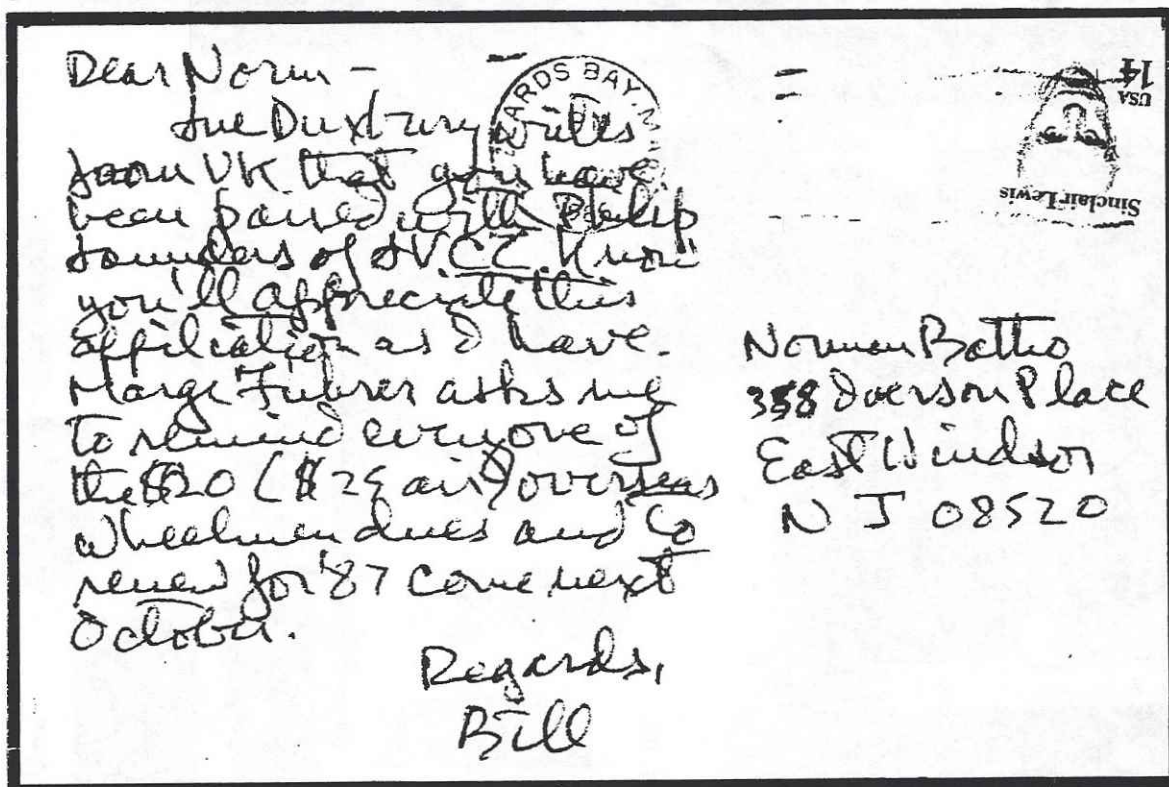

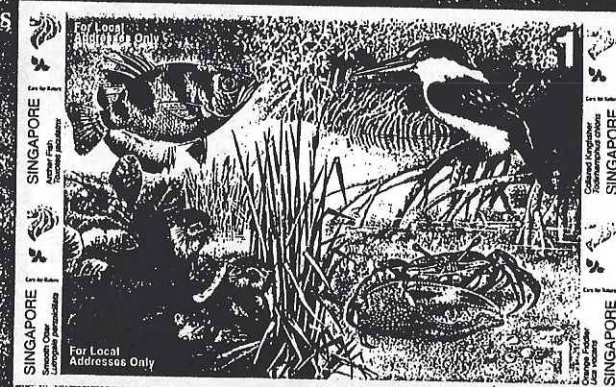
# Care for Nature

A decade of conservation towards a lifetime of resources

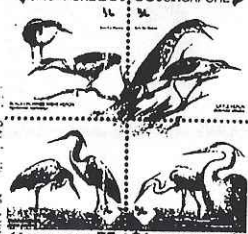
Nature is an intrinsic part of our lives. It provides balance, harmony and supports an endless diversity of life in an intricate and interdependent chain. ## ITALIAN PRIVATE LOCAL SERVICES

When looking for pieces, suitable for my collection, of the private posts operating in Italy during the final period of the Second World War, I have found very little; today it is almost impossible to find any new material. Also, I have been able to find only a little of what I was looking for to add to my Italian Kingdom albums - for the period 1944-45. However, last spring I discovered a very rare item - perhaps a hitherto unknown piece. It consists of a colour proof of stamps printed on behalf of the S.E.I.S. - *Società Espressi Italia Settentrionale* (North Italy Express Company).

The S.E.I.S. carried out the delivery of mail in the Veneto, Lombardy and Emilia until June 1945 when the regular postal services were restored after the end of the Second World War. The mail was generally delivered by cyclists. The amount paid by the sender for this service was the normal postage (1 Lira for regular mail and 2.50 Lire for registered mail) plus an added fee. The mail received a rectangular stamp with the legend S.E.I.S. / [the city] / *Trasporti Rapidi Corrispondeza* (Fast Delivery Mail) and the added fee which rose from 10 to 30 Lire- This was a considerable amount of money for the time.

At the end of June 1945 it was decided to produce five different coloured stamps, perforated and on gummed paper, depicting a cyclist and the face value. First, however, an imperforate proof was printed in yellow and blue on gummed paper (Fig 1). It shows the cyclist against a background of mountain tops and trees.

The stamps were never put into service because, as mentioned before, a regular mail service was restored at the end of June 1945 and all private delivery authorisations were cancelled. The Italian Postal History catalogue, *Unificato 2000*, list the set of five, mint never hinged, at US\$1,000.

In the course of researching issues made by private services, some stamps have been found which refer to the *Collegamento Postale / Frontiera Italo-Svizzera / Zenna-Luino (Posta Centrale)* and which are known as the D.I.S.P.A. set. The area in question is located at the foot of the mountains around Lake Maggiore, where the Italian-Swiss border runs near the Lombard city of Luino. We are not sure that a postal service was ever provided.

# Island Games

Over 2300 athletes will descend on Guernsey this year to take part in a week-long, biennial, multi-discipline sporting spectacular. Between 28 June and 4 July, the Island plays host to competitors in 15 sports, 1000 volunteer helpers and 400 officials from 23 locations around the globe, all gathered together for the Xth NatWest Island Games.

The first Island Games took place in the Isle of Man in 1985 when athletes from 15 islands competed in seven sports. This year's Guernsey-hosted event has grown to 15 sports. These are: Archery, Athletics, Badminton, Basketball, Cycling, Football, Golf, Gymnastics, Sailing/windsurfing, Shooting, Swimming, Table Tennis, Tennis, Triathlon and Volleyball.

Islanders from as far apart as Froya, off the coast of Norway, to the Falklands, just to the east of Cape Horn, the southernmost tip of South America, will compete for gold, silver and bronze medals in a competition so renowned for its sporting spirit that it has become known as the 'Friendly Games.' While the competitive standards are not as high as the Olympic or Commonwealth Games, participants nevertheless achieve a standard of excellence that often sets them on the road to greater endeavour.



With the addition of Bermuda, more Islands than ever before will be taking part this year and current indications are that the 2003 competition will be the biggest Island Games ever. The full list of participating islands are: Alderney, Bermuda, Cayman Islands, Falkland Islands, Faroe Islands, Froya, Gibraltar, Gotland, Greenland, Guernsey, Hitra, Isle of Man, Isle of Wight, Jersey, Orkney, Prince Edward Island, Rhodes, Saaremaa, Sark, Shetland Islands, St. Helena, and Ynys Mon.

The opening ceremony will centre on the capital St Peter Port's natural amphitheatre of Victoria Marina, aptly bringing to the occasion a nautical theme to what is a multi-Island event. Then, competitions will be staged at various

locations whose natural attributes will provide a stunning backdrop to a feast of sports and athletics. Fans can watch all the action, wherever it is, completely free of charge. Focus of attention will be a brand-new stadium, built especially in time to host the track events.

Picturesque Guernsey, which lies in the Bay of St Malo, last hosted the Games in 1987 when 1049 competitors took part and an estimated 300 supporters came to the island. Competitors then were struck by the charm of Guernsey's unique Anglo-French heritage, Renoir-esque locations and breathtaking seascapes.

The Island has a proud tradition of support for these Games as Guernsey's decision-makers recognise that sport can be a very positive influence on people's lives. That is one of the reasons why they are delighted to act as hosts to these 'Friendly Games' for a second time. Designed by Guernsey-girl Charlotte



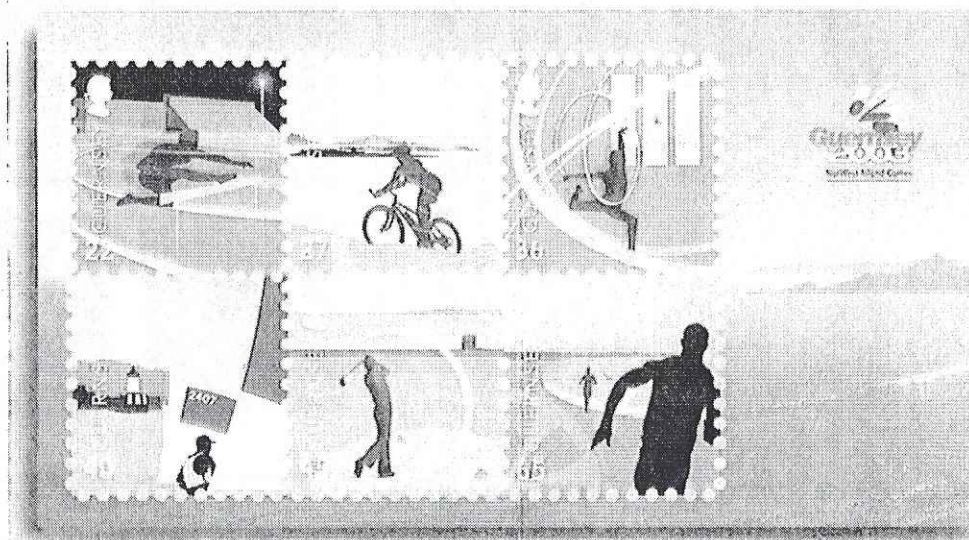

# My thematic collection Brian Sole looks at



## his cycling collection, and its accidental start

MY BICYCLE COLLECTION started by accident. I had been a keen cyclist and a member of the Cyclists' Touring Club for almost 20 years. During National Service I had taken my bicycle to Singapore and Hong Kong at Her Majesty's expense. On my return to the United Kingdom, many weekends were spent youth hostelling. In addition I toured many parts of the UK and Europe by bicycle during my annual holidays.

My schoolboy collection was resurrected whilst moving into a flat, after I married. This was in the late 1960s and I had become aware of the rush of new commemorative GB stamps being issued. As my cycling activities ran down, I found myself spending time mounting GB stamps into my collection. Whilst browsing around stamp shops (there were a lot more in the 1960s and 1970s than today), I noticed the odd East European stamp showing cyclists and the occasional cover, priced very cheaply. Almost unconsciously I bought these items in addition to other purchases and tucked them away in a drawer or cabinet. This renewed interest in stamp collecting led me to buying the occasional stamp magazine, usually the weekly *Stamp Collecting*, on Waterloo Station and I also joined the Insurance & Banking Philatelic Society.

At competition time I entered nine pages of my modern GB stamps. The judge was not impressed and my entry was very much an 'also ran'. A year later a colleague in the office mentioned that he was putting together a thematic entry. This sort of collecting had never occurred to me before, but it did send me to my drawers and cabinets to search out the various cycle items I had purchased. To my surprise it was possible to put together a nine page entry on cycling. It did mean a lot more research than I had anticipated but it was great fun going through the old copies of cycling magazines, bringing back many happy memories. Looking back now, the entry was overwritten. However I did attempt to tell a story. The opening page was about the history of the bicycle illustrated entirely by stamps. There were a couple of pages on the use of the bicycle for postal delivery,

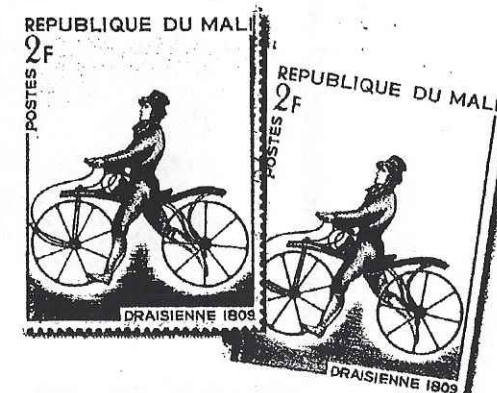
a page or two on leisure including entertainment and the final three pages were on sport. Although I did not win it did persuade me to write up more pages and to begin to extend the collection more actively.

Having won the club thematic trophy the following year, I was asked to be the fourth member in Society visit. This meant a few more pages were hurriedly written up. Very gradually, the collection on cycling took over from my Great Britain and Channel Islands interest and I found myself searching more for cycle material than GB material.

**I recommend anybody who collects stamps, and is hesitating about starting a thematic collection, to take the plunge. Provided the subject is of interest to you, you may be surprised at how enjoyable the exercise can become.**

An entry in the British Philatelic Exhibition (BPE) led to correspondence with a French collector and gradually I found myself in correspondence with many collectors of the same theme. My collection was not unique, as I had thought when I started. On reflection a major step forward was acquiring an 80-page check list, soon after I had prepared my first Club competition entry. In addition, a dealer sent me details of a Bicycles Stamp Club, which I joined eagerly. It soon became apparent that I needed to include philatelic material such as stamp booklets, postal stationery, postmarks and meter marks in addition to stamps. I had enjoyed many friendships with fellow cyclist over the years. I have now discovered that stamp collectors are equally helpful and friendly. In addition to exchanging material with fellow collectors I have been offered material frequently by non-collectors of the bicycle theme, who have kindly put items to one side for me.

I recommend anybody who collects stamps and has been hesitating about starting a thematic collection to take the plunge and make a start. Provided the subject is of interest to you, you may be suprised at how enjoyable the exercise can become •

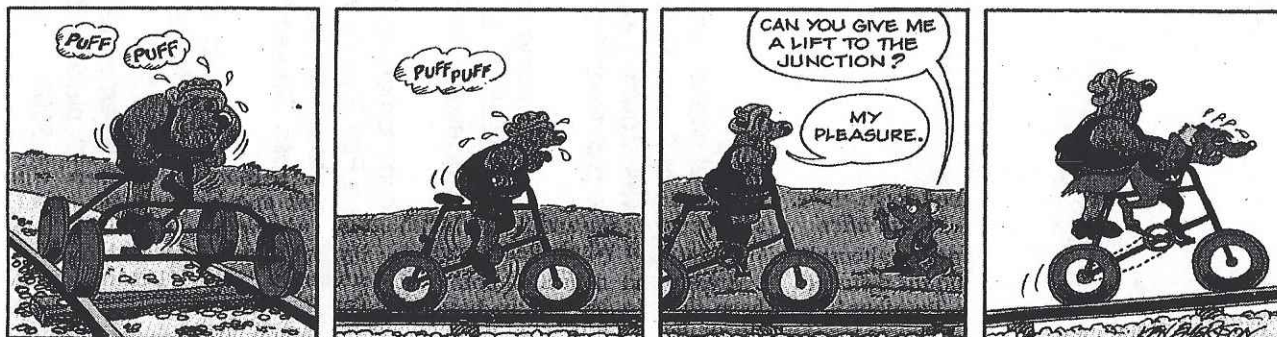

## Mail by milk float

On 24 May Postcomm began consultation on the proposed issue of a short-term licence to Express Ltd (Express), a subsidiary of Express Dairies plc.

Express is seeking a licence to trial the delivery of packets and letters from businesses to householders. They would be delivered by the company's milk delivery network. If granted, the licence would be for 12 months and would limit the number of items to be carried to 4.6 million a year.

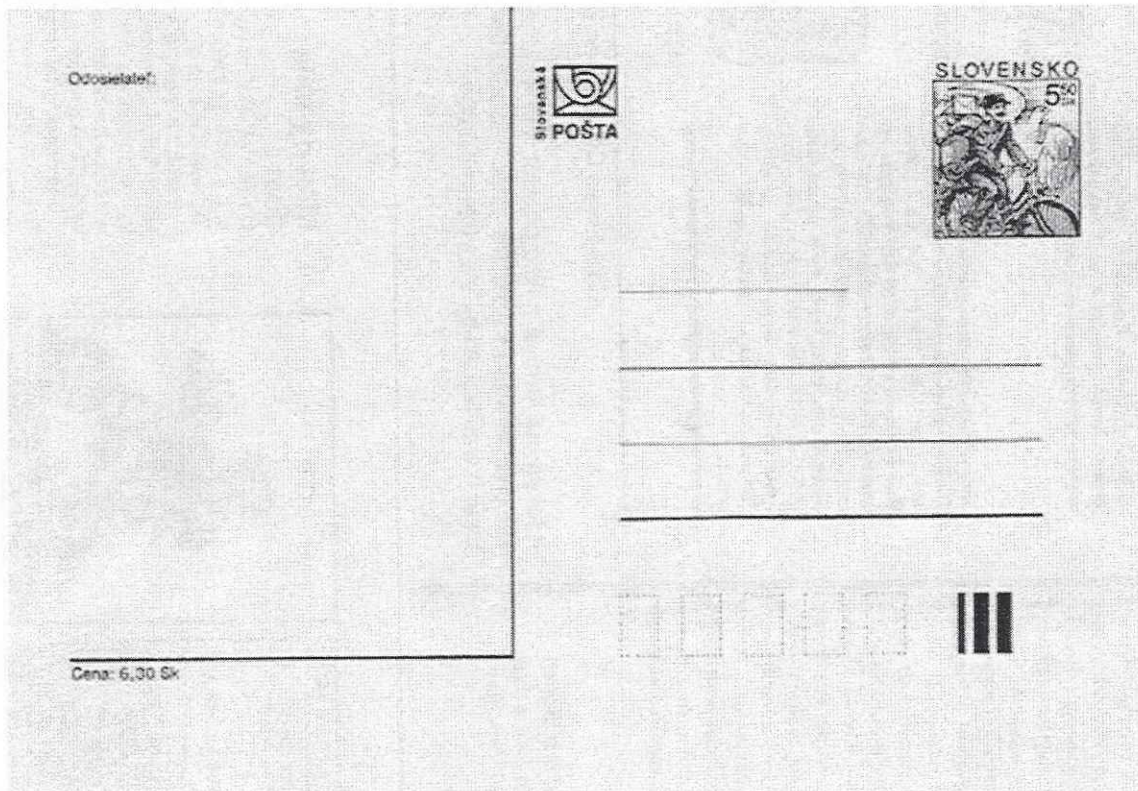
## CZECH and SLOVAK POSTCARDS

### SLOVAKIA

"Stamp Day" Postman postal card:

The card was issued on May 14th, 2001 to encounter the new domestic rate 5,50 Sk, valid since February 1st, 2001. The basic (empty) card was released for general use and also for official cachets to be printed on the left side of the card.



PL60, the first official cachet, was issued to commemorate the most beautiful Slovak stamp for the year 2000 - The History of Postal Rules (20 Sk) - with the picture of queen Maria Theresa and old Bratislava (Maria Theresa was crowned in Bratislava/Pressburg/Poszony as well as many other Austro-Hungarian kings/queens). The picture on the cachet is almost the same as the picture on the stamp.

PL61, issued 09.06.01 to commemorate the BELGICA 2001 Exhibition and 500 years of postal service in Europe. The text "500 ROKOV EUROPSKEJ POSTY" means "500 Years of European Post (-al Service)". The date of issue was the first day of the Belgica Exhibition.

PL62, issued to commemorate the 7th European Fair Play Congress which took place in Bratislava, Slovakia. There is a Fair Play "5 yellow rings, Fair Play logo, logo of Slovak Olympic Committee and view of the Bratislava old town with the Bratislava Castle and the River Danube. The date of issue might be the first day of the Congress, September 13th 2001.

PL63, issued to commemorate 60 years of the Faculty of Electrotechnic and Informatics of the Slovak Technical University in Bratislava.

PL64, issued to commemorate the ŽILINFILA 2001 National Stamp Exhibition, with international participation, which took place in Žilina, Slovakia. The date of issue might be the first day of the ZILINFILA Exhibition, October 5th 2001.

# From My Musette

- \* **Amphilex 2002** - Brian Sole advises that, at this International Stamp Exhibition, held in the Netherlands, August 30<sup>th</sup> to September 3<sup>rd</sup> 2002, two of our members exhibited. Jari Majander entered "The wheels of chance, an introduction to cycling", he gained 88 marks and was awarded a Large Vermeil medal and a Special Prize; a fine effort. Vojtech Jankovič entered "The world of pedals" and was awarded 83 marks and a Vermeil medal.

There were also two other cycle exhibits, Brian wished he could have seen them but, as he had only recently returned from his trip to Korea, he could not afford a trip to the Netherlands a week or so later. Charles Schutz (France) entered "La petite Reine" and gained 82 marks and a Vermeil medal; Marc-André Elsig (Switzerland) - previously a member - entered "2 Roues, 200 ans d'histoire de la 'Petite Reine'" gaining 77 marks and a Large Silver medal.

- \* **Philatelic Thematic Exhibition** - Piet Hein Hilarides advises that, at a recent Exhibition in Dieren (NL) in November 2002, he entered a 60-page exhibit titled "Do you cycle with me?" He gained 74 marks and was awarded a Vermeil medal in class 2.

- \* **Triathlon** - In a recent exchange of correspondence with Piet we were discussing what constitutes a "bicycle stamp" and he raised the question of whether a stamp that bears the word 'triathlon' but does not show a cyclist or a bicycle should be considered a bicycle stamp. I consider a triathlon a contest comprising three separate disciplines, ie: 100m sprint, high jump and shot-put; or horse-riding, trap-shooting and fly-casting and does not necessarily include cycling. Therefore a stamp which only bears the word 'triathlon' cannot be considered a "bicycle stamp". What are your thoughts on this intriguing question?

- \* **Spanish "ONCE" issue of 27.12.88** - Jordi Quintana raised the question of whether this stamp should be considered a "bicycle stamp" as they sponsor a professional team. He uses the argument that this should follow the inclusion of the Netherlands' Rabobank 19.05.98 issue. I wrote to Piet in this regard and he agrees that these are not "real bicycle stamps" for you do not see a bicycle, a cyclist or the word 'cyclist' on the stamps. He further advises that he will not include these in his catalogue.

- \* **"Two pints today please, postman!"** - *The following extract appeared in the July 2002 issue of Gibbons' Stamp Monthly.*

The front page of our once-esteemed 'journal of record' *The Times* features 'trailers' for news items expanded on an inside page. In the 25 May 2002 issue these included one coyly titled 'Milking it':

'Milkmen aim to deliver the post in specially converted milkfloats that can go up to 50mph. Express Dairies is expected to win a licence for deliveries in London, Birmingham and Manchester'.

When your mind has stopped boggling at the news, you realise that it's cross-referenced to page 56 - and that the newspaper has only 28 pages. It seems 'The Thunderer' has now become 'the journal of news, views and jovial japes.'

But, given that Consignia plc has been granted an extension of its monopoly until April 2007 (unless that's another April Fools' joke), there is certainly time for dairies to organise themselves for house-to-house mail deliveries - though it will seem a bit strange putting out your mail in a well-washed bottle.

- \* **This way for the stinkies** - *The following extract appeared in the June 2002 issue of Gibbons' Stamp Monthly.*

In August 1999, Brazil's postal administration issued four self-adhesives drawing attention to the importance of preventing forest fires. The cause is a worthy one - but did they really have to rub it in by making the stamps stink of burnt wood?

Having got the idea, this year they gave us a set for the centenary of the Centre of Commerce for Coffee of Rio de Janeiro. Need I tell you that they're impregnated with coffee resin so that they smell like coffee?

In GB we've had a stamp smelling of eucalyptus - but you had to scratch it to release the stink and so damage the surface (non-postally used by fingernail, I presume); Switzerland gave us a sheetlet of stamps that looked like a block of chocolate: one guess what it smelled of. Hong Kong issued a set in 2001 with the delicate fragrance of jasmine tea (did you notice?); Norfolk Island produced some scent-smelling stamps - and there's plenty more like them.

But do the stinks migrate from stamp to album page, and indeed do the smells of two different issues merge or fight one another? Burnt-wood chocolate, eucalyptus-and-jasmine tea, the scent of rose-flavoured coffee?

It's a whole new world out there; do you think it may even attract some new and very nosy collectors?



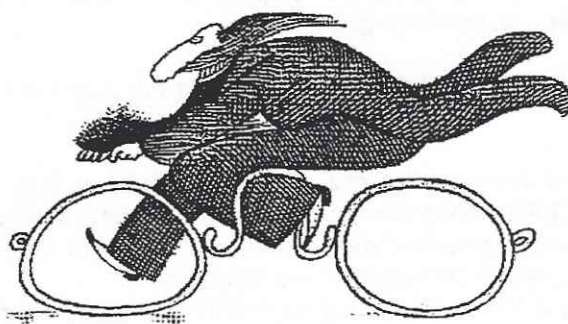
## Czechoslovakia – stamp BIB 1981

The Czechoslovak stamp was issued in a BIB'81 series to commemorate the biannual exhibition of children's book illustrations named Biennial of Illustrations Bratislava (abbr. BIB). BIB takes part every two years and several stamps are issued to the exhibition. Usually winning illustrations from previous exhibition are used for the stamp design. In the particular case, the stamp depicts illustrations of a famous Czech illustrator and painter Adolf Born for the children book "Akademia pana Machulu" (Academy of Mr. Machula) by Polish writer Jan Brzechwa. The book is about Mr. Machula and his academy in which he teaches children to do some tricks. In 1979, A. Born won the Golden Apples prize for those illustrations (there is one Grand Prix and five Golden Apples of BIB being awarded to the best illustrations on each BIB). The book was issued by "Mlade Leta" publishing house in Bratislava, Slovakia in 1978.

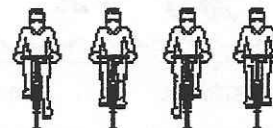
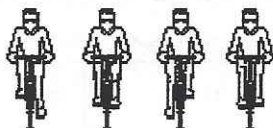

On the stamp, among others, an old wizard Mr. Machula is sitting on his big binocular riding it to reach quickly some traffic accident. The picture is used 7 times in the book (the attached scan is from the 3<sup>rd</sup> page showing the author, title, publishing house and year). It is interesting that on the original illustrations in the book, Mr. Machula is riding from right to left, while on the stamp from left to right. Probably, due to the graphical concept of the stamp, the designer inverted the picture. The text in the book is as follows: "Mr. Machula took his binocular and used his magic pump to make it as big as a bicycle. He sat on it as on regular bike and riding ahead showed us the path to the ...".

That's all the information I can collect on the topic. I guess the stamp is related to the bicycle topic, even the connection is somehow "obtuse". One could admit, that Mr. Machula is sitting behind the binocular on both book and stamp illustrations.

Now I send you a short note from the POSTEX, a yearly philatelic event in Apeldoorn (in the Dutch Province of Gelderland). For the first time TPG post has designed a bicycle related special cancellation for this stamp show.

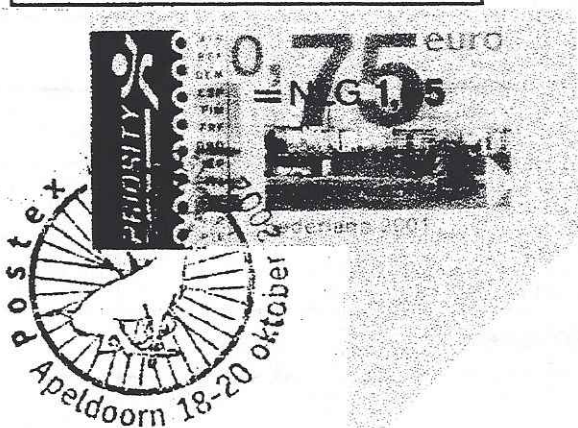
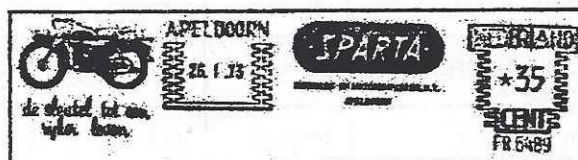
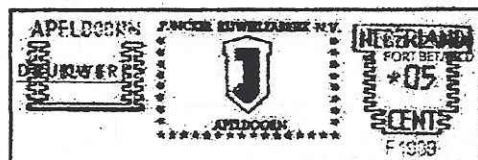
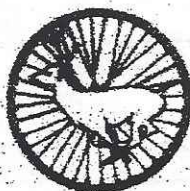
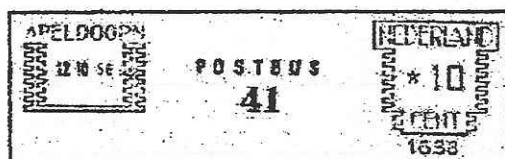
The (rein)deer refers to the big (national) parc 'De Veluwe' near Apeldoorn and the bicycle wheel probably refers to the possibility to cross that area by bike. It seems to me that it must have a relation to the former important bicycle industry in Apeldoorn as well.



Some facts of 100 years of bicycle production in Apeldoorn are:

- 1898 Foundation of JUNCKER and production start of that bicycle factory
- 1917 Foundation of the bicycle factory SPARTA
- 1920 Production start of the bicycle factory SPARTA
- 1965 Relocation of the bicycle production of LOCOMOTIEF and SIMPLEX (from Amsterdam to the JUNCKER factory in Apeldoorn)
- 1968 End of production bicycles by JUNCKER; takeover by Gazelle (including the trademark LOCOMOTIEF and the trademark SIMPLEX)
- 1999 End of production (motorized) bicycles by SPARTA; takeover by Accell (Batavus)

There are four bicycle industry related meter marks known of Apeldoorn, two of JUNCKER and two of SPARTA (see at the bottom of this note).
