

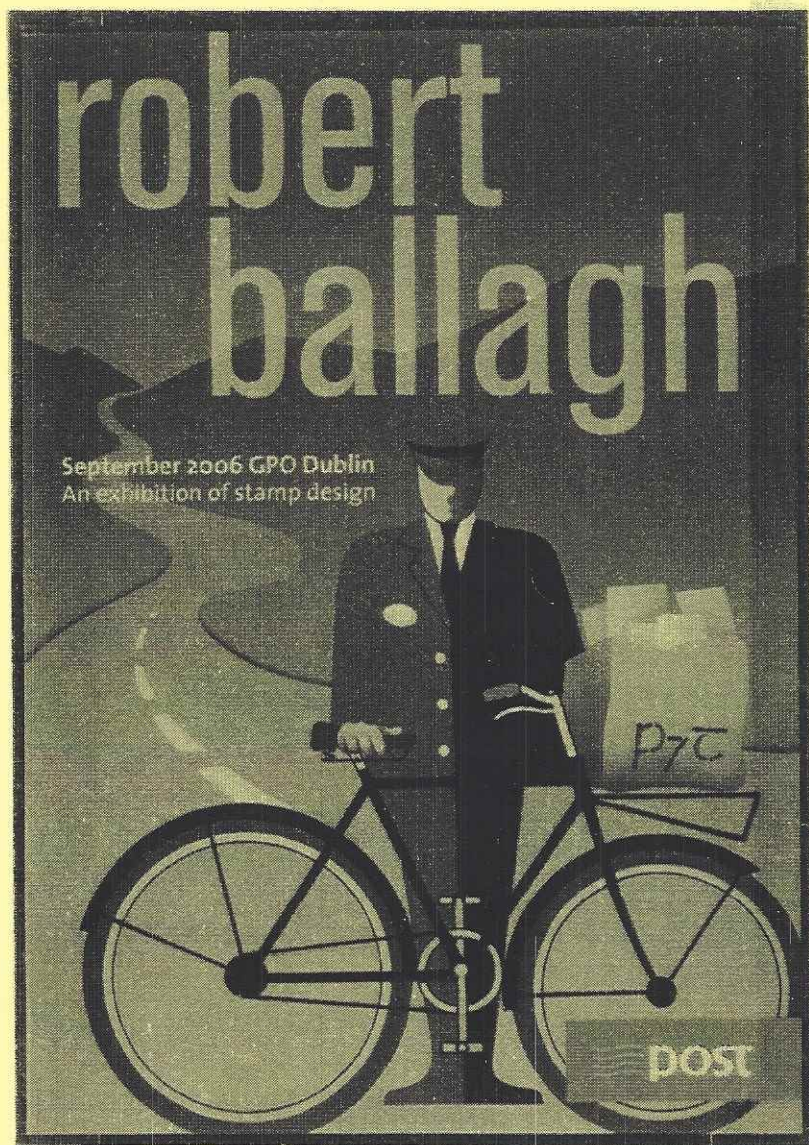

Après un prologue dans le centre de Londres et une première étape vers la ville historique de Canterbury, les coureurs disputeront, le lundi 9 juillet, une 2<sup>ème</sup> étape de 167 Km entre Dunkerque et Gand, où l'arrivée sera jugée sur l'avenue Charles de Kerckhove.

Tom Boonen y trouvera peut-être un terrain de prédilection pour voler la victoire à McEwen, Petacchi et Hushovd dans un sprint prestigieux plein de suspense. Parviendra-t-il à endosser le maillot jaune, à l'instar de Marc Wauters en 2001 lors d'une étape vers la ville d'Anvers? # The Peace Race

by Tony E. Howes

The story in stamps of the finest years of the world's most important amateur cycling stage race.

## Inaugural Event - 1948



Poland



Following the devastation of Central Europe by the second world war, the first "Peace Race" in May, 1948 was a relatively humble affair - run as two simultaneous events connecting Warsaw and Prague. It was an amateur race and remained so because cyclists from the Eastern bloc were not allowed to become professionals and their teams were not invited to the major stage races of the West such as the Tour de France.

The two 1948 races were won by Yugoslavs - August Prosinek and Alexander Zoric. The 1949, 1950 and 1951 races continued between the same two cities but no stamps were issued. Winners were 1949 - Jan Vesely (Czechoslovakia), 1950 - Willi Emborg (Denmark), 1951 - Kay Allan Olsen (Denmark).

On the fifth anniversary of the race Berlin was included for the first time. The Polish stamp features the arms of the three cities which became a regular feature on the event's commemorative stamps.

This was the first and only year when Great Britain enjoyed any real success in the race with Ian Steel in first place and GB winning the team award.

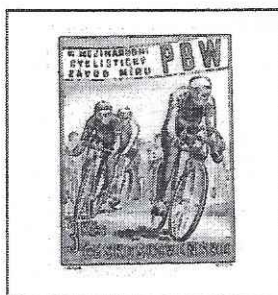

Poland and East Germany issued sets of two stamps for 1954, 1955 and 1956 but Czechoslovakia just one in 1956. The arms of the three cities, Warsaw, Berlin and Prague continue to be featured, although virtually unrecognisable on rather dull Polish issues.

In addition to issues by the three host countries for the race, wider participation by the Eastern bloc countries was indicated by issues in the Soviet Union and Romania. In fact, the race winner was Nentscho Christov, first and only winner to date from Bulgaria.

No stamps were issued for the years 1958 to 1961 when the race continued to alternate its starts between Warsaw, Berlin and Prague with winners - 1958 Piet Damen (Netherlands), 1959 - Gustav-Adolf Schur (GDR), 1960 - Eric Hagen (GDR), 1961 Juri Melichov (Soviet Union).

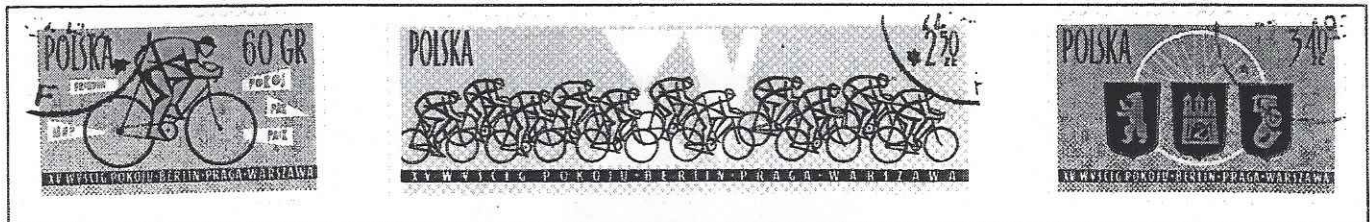

East Germany, hosting the start for only the second time, issued three stamps featuring notable buildings of the three cities - Prague Castle, Warsaw "Palast fur Kultur und Wissensch" and Berlin "Rotes Rathaus". The 1962 race was won by Gainan Saidchushin (Soviet Union).

No stamps were issued 1963 to 1966 when the race routes and winners were:

- 1963 Prague -Warsaw - Berlin Klaus Ampler (GDR)
- 1964 Warsaw - Berlin - Prague Jan Smolik (Czechoslovakia)
- 1965 Berlin - Prague - Warsaw Gennadi Lebedjev (Soviet Union)
- 1966 Prague - Warsaw - Berlin Bernard Guyot (France)

## The Peace Race

In 1985 the race included, for the first time, a visit to MOSCOW (Prague - Moscow - Warsaw - Berlin) and was won by Lech Piasecki of Poland.

In 1986 only the Soviet Union issued a stamp for the 39<sup>th</sup> running of the event which started in Kiev in the Ukraine then visiting Warsaw - Berlin - Prague.

The winner was Olaf Ludwig, beginning a four year East German domination of the event.



### 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary - 1987



Only the Soviet Union issued a stamp for the fortieth anniversary of the race. "Perestroika" and "Glasnost" were the forces shaping the region and two years later in November 1989 came the fall of the Berlin Wall and the restructuring of Eastern Europe.

- 1987 Berlin - Prague - Warsaw Uwe Ampler (GDR - East Germany)
- 1988 Bratislava - Katowice - Berlin Uwe Ampler (GDR - East Germany)
- 1989 fittingly run between Warsaw - Berlin - Prague for the last time and a record breaking third consecutive win for Uwe Ampler of East Germany who was to win again in 1998 as a citizen of Germany and a member of the united team.

*The Peace Race subsequently lost importance and no longer visits Warsaw, Berlin and Prague each year. It continues to be run as a minor event on the international calendar but the possibility of another commemorative stamp is remote. As of January 2007 the stamps displayed on these sheets are a complete set.*

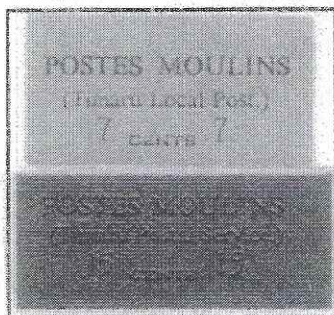
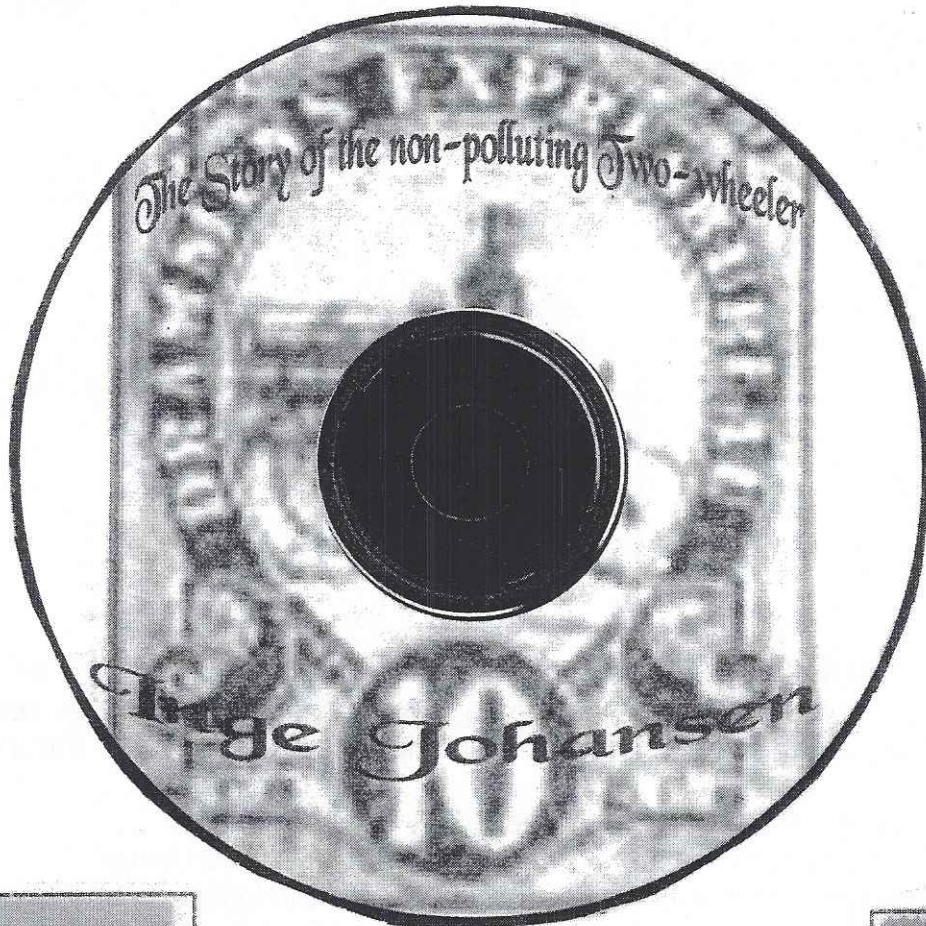


# Bicycle Stamp Exhibits

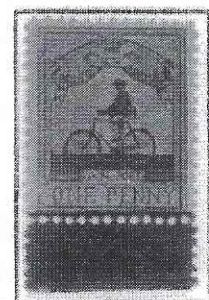

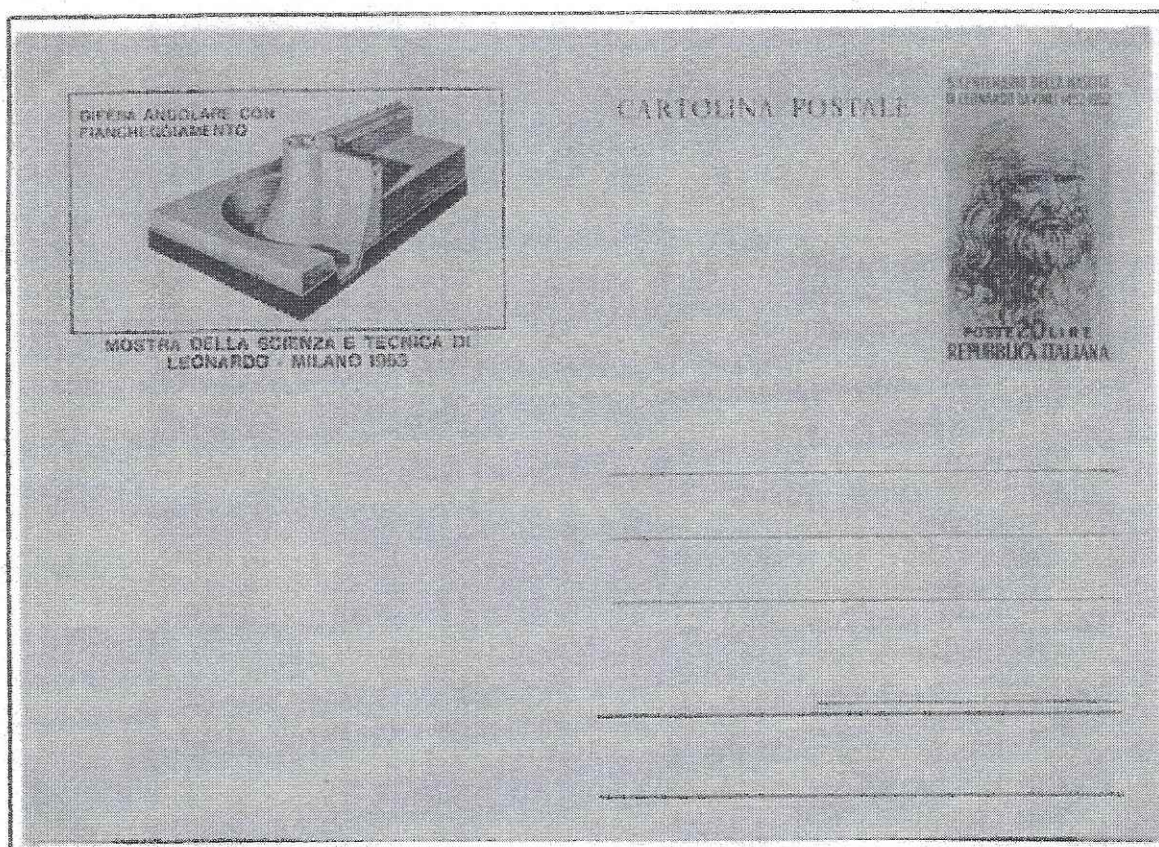




## 1.1. The first Bicycle



The first bicycle was on a drawing made by Leonardo da Vinci around year 1482



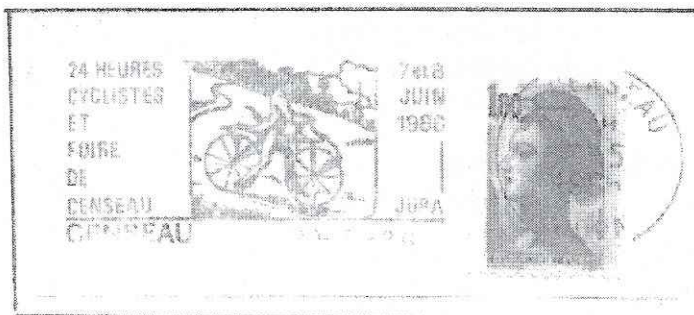
Leonardo da Vinci was born April 4, 1452 and died April 23, 1519

The first bicycle on the road was made by the French count de Sivrac in 1791. There was not steering on it, and he called the "bicycle" Célérifère

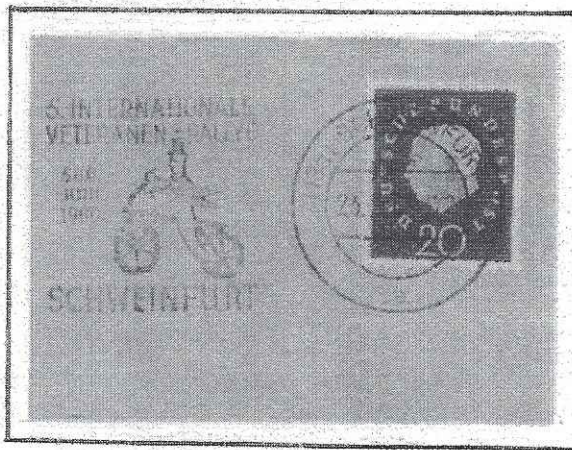




## 1.2. The other constructors



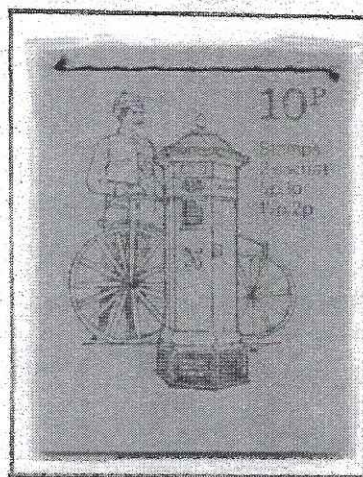

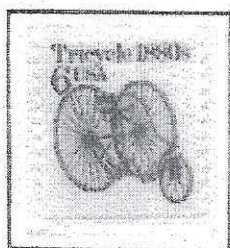
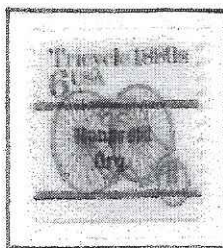
von Sauerbronn was an important person in the development. He was also father of the Draisienne for the railway, which is the direct forerunner of the bicycle.



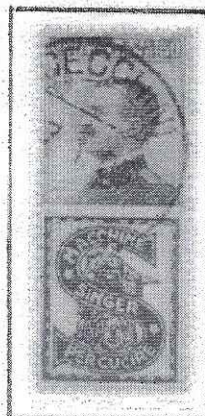
Other great name who made bicycles was Hedges, Premier and the hoof beater Michaux.

The tricycle "Boneshaker" came around 1860. It got it's name because it very heavy and shaken a lot.



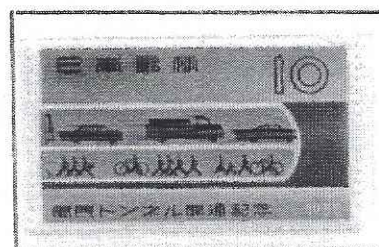
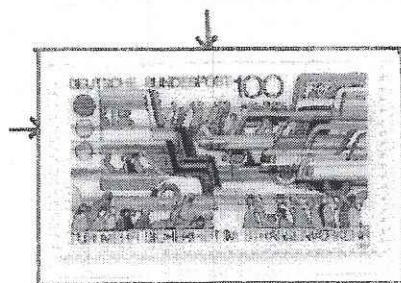
Singer, is known by needle machines, was a pioneer with tricycle and he made also with four wheels.

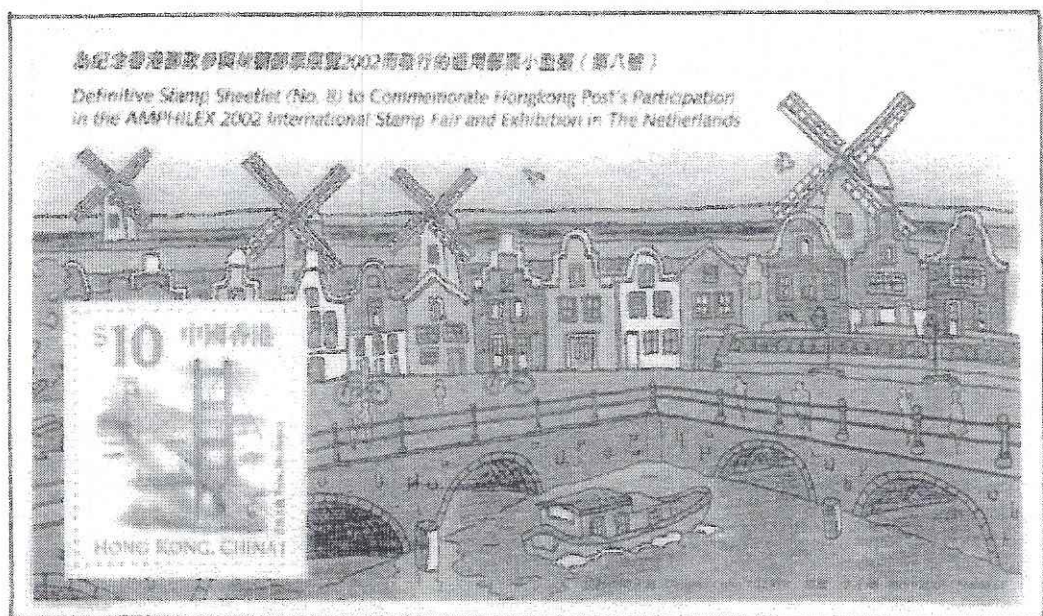

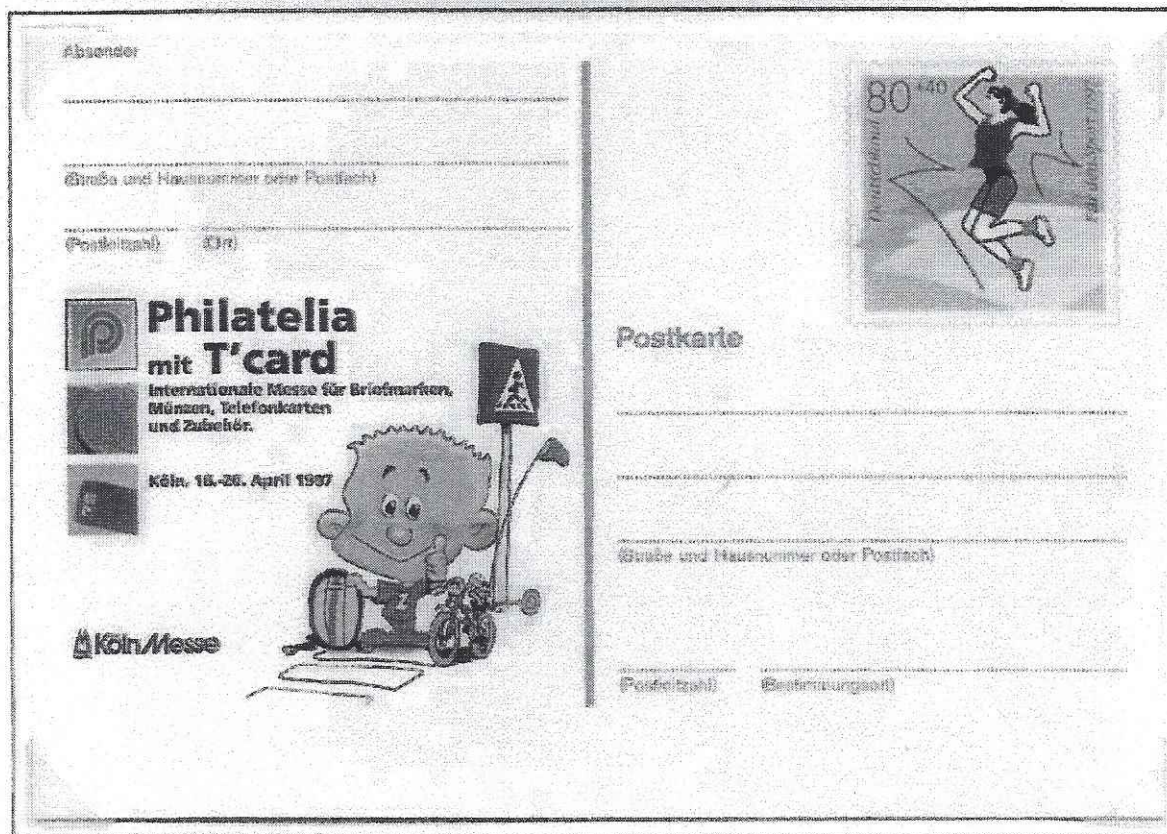

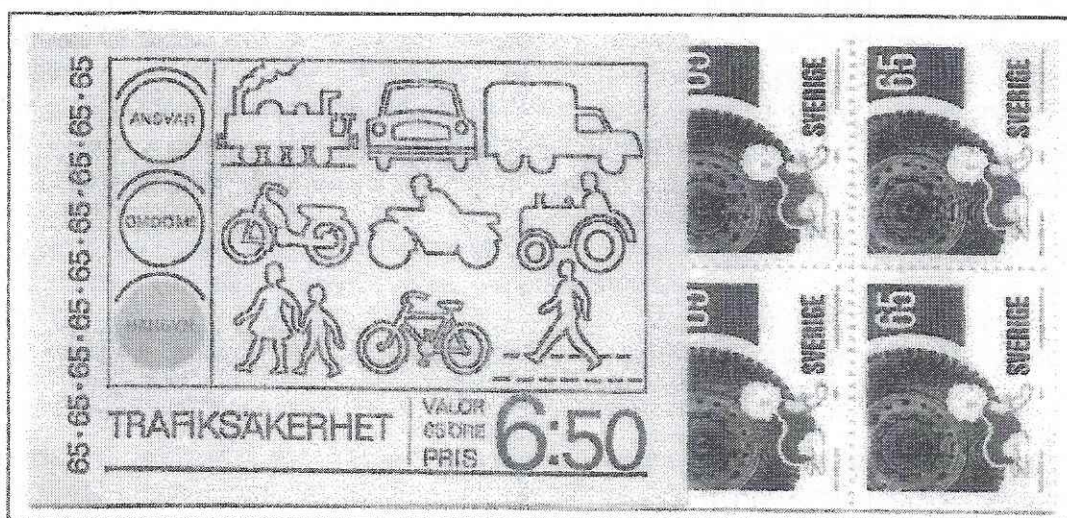
