### **Editorial**



#### FROM THE PRESIDENT

Once more I must apologise for the late issue of BS 74 and pass my grateful thanks to Thomas Matthies who has provided details of New Stamp issues, assisted by Piet Hein Hilarides.

Mick Robinson, a stalwart of the East Grinstead Cycle Club and Assistant UK Treasurer of BSC, died suddenly on 21 March 2012. He was 76 years old. I attended his Memorial Service on 3 April 2012. A group of about 20 members of the Cycling Club, wearing club jerseys, rode in formation in front of the hearse. During his Memorial Service there were moving tributes to him by daughter Michelle, who mentioned his bicycle stamp collection, and a member of the Cycle Club, who detailed the many voluntary tasks and positions undertaken willingly by Mick over the years. The exit music was "Bicycle Race" by Queen. A fitting end on an occasion that was up-lifting.

BSC member Brian Mynott sent me a copy of an Egyption Postcard, postmarked Cairo 14 Nov. 1897 The writer declined an invitation to join the <u>L.B. Club</u> "as I do not bicycle a great deal and Willlington is too faroff to join in the bicycle rides". Brian asked what the initials "L.B." meant?

A thematic collector kindly sent me an example of a local private post in Bude Cornwall. The organiser rode a "penny-farthing" bicycle to deliver the local letters and arranged for a stamp to be printed, also featuring a "penny-farthing". I understand that the service was short-lived.

No doubt many of you followed the Olympic Games this summer, in which G.B. did particularly well in the Cycling events. Thomas has detailed the many GB issues in his "New Issue" report. On the front page of this issue of "Bicycle Stamps", there is a copy of a sheet of 6 stamps, without denomination, from a proof sheet of 4 mini sheets, headed "Team GB Monday 18 June 2012 Venue and Location". A similar proof sheet was apparently issued to Postmasters as advance warning of the format and design to expect for each GB Olympic gold medallist. The wording at bottom left of the A4 sheet reads "GMWE1 Issue Date 19 June 2012 Printer location London"

I have heard from Felicity, daughter of the late Graham Wade, a past president of BSC and designer of Papua New Guinea stamps. She is considering disposing of her father's bicycle stamp collection and may allow the Club to assist in its disposal.

Olympic Gold Medal Heroes (Excerpts from the Royal Mail press release):

The main image of the stamp will, wherever possible, be a photograph of the Team GB athlete or team in action from their gold medal winning final. Where this is not possible, the image will be of the athlete's gold medal winning journey taken from a heat or from their gold medal award moment on the podium.

This will be the first time any host country has used action shots for Gold Medal stamps and issued them next day, during the Games. This will also be a first for next day stamps from Royal Mail.

Gold Medal stamps will be on sale at 500 selected UK Post Office Branches by lunchtime the next day and on <a href="www.royalmail.com">www.royalmail.com</a> after each gold medal win by Team GB. They will then be distributed three times during the Games to a further 4,500 Post Office Branches nationwide .All of the 500 selected Post Office Branches will open on Sundays during the Games

Stanley Gibbons catalogue editor confirms each gold medal stamp will be assigned its own SG number providing the stamps are readily available. The location of the digital overprinter (but not the name, 6 different) will be shown in the selvedge of the A4 sheet at bottom left.

#### THE NORTHERN ITALY CYCLE COURIERS

#### by Gianfranco Rossetti & Emilio Zucchi

first published in "Posta Militare", September, 2010.

This is an article on the private courier postal service that operated in Northern Italy during the R.S.I. and Lieutenancy periods of March to June 1945. We think it opportune to open up the discussion. The principal Italian catalogues do not list the three sets as postage stamps or of any postal value, even when applied to letters, but as etiquettes printed by a private company to indicate the sum collected in consideration of the service offered. This includes the etiquettes printed CORALIT similar to postage stamps with an indication of face value and found in catalogues: but as we shall see later, in fact there existed an earlier series of twenty used for the same purpose and scope but without the indication of face value, whose use corresponded to Lire 14.

In the first months of 1945, when the final phase of the war in Italy commenced, in every way more grave and heavy were the difficulties and the emergencies that hindered the regular and well-timed transport of the post

in the territory of the Repubblica Sociale Italiane, by this time much reduced following the offensive and advance of Allied Forces in the autumn of 1944, to the Italian northern provinces ith the exclusion of Romagna. The continued Anglo-American aerial bombardment reduced to a minimum the working the of the railway, whilst the destruction of


bridges on principal roads and the frequent machinegunning of vehicles travelling along them had defeated the insecure operation of postal transport services that the R.S.I. Minister of Communications had organised in August, 1944 on the principal roads of northern Italy as an alternative to the railway. The state of emergency was greatly aggravated by the shortage of means of transport, due for the main part to being requisitioned for war service by the Germans.

To confront such a state of emergency, the R.S.I. government and its Prefectures prepared a series of

initiatives to supplement the services of the post office called "communal postal services" and the delivery of mail in part by the big banks by normal means and in part by private firms using goods vehicles.

It was in this fashion that the private carriage service of more important mail was born and began to function, the turning point for the scale and effectiveness of activities carried out in that period in Italy. That service was realised by CORALIT through a system of couriers on bicycles. Because of the simplicity of the means of locomotion used, these cyclist couriers were able to cover in sufficiently reduced times the big roads of northern Italy devastated by bombing, with the risk of being machinegunned and crossing zones concerned in the guerrilla warfare of the partisan brigades; pedalling in adverse weathers and crossing rivers on improvised ferries or on luckily surviving small bridges.

Of the rest it is significant that in the "Gazzettino di

Venezia" of 15th December 1944, there appeared an article entitled "More on postal services. To the post of the trains..........and by way of motor transport and even the bicycle can have its say." Contrary to the "deficiencies in the postal service" the writer of the article ~ we do not know if he was inspired by the same CORALIT ~ suggested the organisation "..of a regular service of courier cyclists to exploit the system of the staffetta" (an 1800s & 1900s mounted courier) calculating that by couriers doing 40 kilometre each it would be possible to cover the Turin-Venice journey in three days.

The Societa r.l. 'Corrieri Alta Italia

– CORALIT' was constituted on 23<sup>rd</sup> November 1944 to carry out the activities of the "transport of goods and things on account of a third party" with its head office in Campo Santa Marina 6072, Venice, under the administration of Carlo Stupar.

On 20<sup>th</sup> February 1945 the R.S.I. Minister of Communications with Provision No. 402448/B-series IV-Div. I (of which it has not been possible to trace the original document) authorised CORALIT to operate in the Veneto "a correspondence delivery service in 'corso particolare' by means of cycle couriers." directed to an express delivery of registered letters between the cities of Venice, Padua, Treviso, Vicenza and Verona.

In these cities CORALIT opened one or more agencies for the collection of letters for delivery which then sorted them into destinations to be then forwarded by means of the cycle couriers.

On 26th March 1945, by a letter from the Director General of Posts & Telegraphs, reference number 402448 B, CORALIT was authorised to extend its services to the cities of Brescia, Bergamo, Milan, Novara, Vercelli and Turin and the other way towards the cities of Ferrara, Rovigo and Trieste. As a consequence the company as

well as opening a second head office in Turin at via Cavour, 21 (where the Administrator Stupar transferred himself) opened new agencies in that city and at Desenzano and at Santhia.

The cyclists of CORALIT were recruited from those who enjoyed exemption from military service, possessing attitudes necessary to the carrying out of the demanding service: and at the time of engagement the courier had to sign a declaration of loyalty and responsibility, with the obligation, between the other conditions, that the mail to be taken at the possible verification request of the censor: the non-fulfilment would involve denunciation to the competent authorities.

The cyclists were given a special bilingual pass (fig.1) to present at various points to Italian military bases and German institutes on the route to impede the movements and actions of the partisans and a "foglio di viaggioreiseschein" (way-bill), again bilingual, which showed the dates of the journeys, the routes taken, the times of departure and arrival, and the number of letters carried and handed over. We show a copy of this document (fig.2), the original being in the Rossetti collection.

For the performance of the service of CORALIT the tariffs were: L14 for every letter of 10 grammes up to 50 grammes and L14 every 20 grammes thereafter. To give examples ~ letter up to 10 grammes (the most common) = L14; letter of 11 to 20 grammes = L28; letter of 41 to 50 grammes = L70; letter from 51 to 70 grammes = L84.

These are comparatively high tariffs for those times but adequate consideration must be given to the difficulties of the service and above all the efficiency that it characterised. From the notices of the time there is no record of a piece of mail being lost, and of particular significant is a letter sent by a courier on horseback on 25th April 1945 on a route that remained blocked and which reached its destination a few days after the end of the war.

To vouch for collection of the tariff CORALIT used etiquettes, properly produced, and, as stated at the beginning, were of four types. From the postal scene point of view the CORALIT methods of service (important among other things to identify the numerous fake philatelic items at present on the market) were as follows:


~ letters entrusted to CORALIT agencies were franked at the letter rate tariff of first step to 20 gr. = L1; for second step of 21 to 250 gr. = L2, and so on; there was an express rate of L2,50; and for mail sent "corso particolare" the letter had to be taken to the local post office for cancelling of the postage stamps.

The office returned the form having applied its date stamp and having cancelled the postage stamps, applied the etiquettes or the 'R' handstamp and proceeded with delivery of mail to the addressees by means of normal postal service distribution.





collected and the relative date. This handstamp was not supplied to agencies set up on the expansion of the service. On the back of the letter a four-line handstamp was applied giving the name and address of the agency, and for every L14 collected an etiquette was applied which bore the name of the courier's route, e.g. Verona-Treviso.

Dealing with the first CORALIT issue, confined to the service developed in the Veneto, the etiquettes were sized 32 x 18mm, rouletted, without gum, printed in black on different coloured papers and showing the



intended routes. They had a prearranged value of fourteen lire. There were twenty diffent labels in the series, of which not all have been recorded, to be applied to mail leaving each of the five agencies (Venice, Treviso, Padua, Vicenza and Verona) destined to one of the other four. (fig.5).

Of the fifteen letters of this type, properly sent to their destinations through the CORALIT system, and certainly not of philatelic origin, in our possession or known to us, only two bear a double etiquette to make a L28 rate (11-20 grammes step); whilst nine are recorded for Venice-Vicenza; Vicenza-Venice; Venice-Padua; Venice-Treviso; Treviso-Venice; Venice-Verona; Padua-Verona; Treviso-Padua and Treviso-Verona. (figs. 6, 7 & 8) The first CORALIT letter known was on the Venice-Verona route and dated 23.3.1945, three days after the official authorisation for the service. The use of the first issue etiquette, limited to the five cities of the Veneto. terminated at the end of March 1945. The last recorded date being 29th March.

2. After the 26th March 1945, with the extension of the service to the new cities which did not use the first issue etiquettes, CORALIT adopted the practice of applying a small white label to the back of the letter similar to those used by 'recapito autorizzato' agencies, printed in black and bearing progressive numbering and the legend 'Corrieri Alta Italia/"CORALIT"/Trasporto Corrispondenze a mezzo Corrieri Ciclisti/Data...../L......' (fig.9)

The use of these labels is known to us from 9th April to 30th May 1945 on letters sent from Bergamo; Milan; Venice; Padua and Treviso.

In the meantime the dates of despatch and arrival of letters entrusted to CORALIT in the last part of March and in the month of April showed a significant lengthening of the time for delivery, e.g. Treviso to Rovigo four days; Padua-Verona five days; Treviso-Milan eight days. It is logical to remember that in these cases CORALIT and it cyclists found themselves in the forefront of an aggravated wartime and logistical emergency.



9. Registered letter to Moltrasio carried by CORALIT from Treviso to Milan. Franked on departure L1 Fratelli Bandieri cancelled Treviso 10.4.45 cds. On reverse white CORALIT label No. 01561 dated 9.4.45 and valued at 'L14'. Franked for registration L1,50 at Milan on 18.4.45 and forwarded by through the normal post office to Moltrasio (Como) arrived on the 20th.






3. A little after halfway through April 1945, CORALIT had printed at Turin two new etiquettes, imperforate and ungummed, with values of L14 and L28, in blue and red on white paper respectively.

They show a white oval surrounded by a carpet of lines and a frame with the legend 'Corrieri Alta Italia \* S.P. Autorizzato Di Stato/L14 or L28'. (fig.10). As to the state of our knowledge we are given to understand that the use of these etiquettes was confined to Piedmont and Milan for a temporary period of less than fifteen days and their use was very limited. The CORALIT agencies cancelled these a proper

handstamp showing the location and date. To date we know of no example franked with the L28 etiquette and of the L14 we know of three examples on registered letters properly posted and travelling to destination. Two were sent during the last days in the life of the R.S.I. ~ from Turin to Milan on 20.4.45 and

from Santhia to Padua on 23.4.45 (fig.11) and one on the first day after the end of the war from Milan on 3.5.45 by CORALIT to Novara in a day and then from there by the civil post to Meina. (fig.12)

4. In the last few days of April CORALIT produced in Turin a third series etiquettes comprising five values with face values in multiples of fourteen lire, (lire 14, 28, 56, 70 and 140) imperforate, printed photolithography, in sheets of 50, on yellow gummed paper and in diverse colours. The subjects of the vignette were the Lion of San Marco for the first three values and a white bicycle wheel superimposed on a map of northern Italy for the two top values. (fig.13)


The printing is similar

to postage stamps ~ the presence of top values of improbable postal use and the fact that the printed numbers were noted, particularly in respect of usage, as 104,000 examples of the L14 to 11,850 of the L140. These are elements that lead one suspect a philatelic influence in their existence confirmed by the




13. The five etiquettes of the third CORALIT issue (Turin)


fact that numerous philatelicly used examples exist, often outside the tariffs, which have not travelled, or have been absolutely manufactured and are more or less evident fakes.

Small are the numbers of letters properly posted, almost always franked with the etiquette of L14 and L28. The first date of use known is on a registered letter from Turin to Novara franked with an etiquette for L28 cancelled 'Coralit di Torino' of 28.4.1945 and also bearing the Turin post office date stamp, arriving at Novara on 3<sup>rd</sup> May. It is the only known example to us of this issue used in the R.S.I. period. It is made more precious by the fact that it is accompanied by a copy of the rare 75c. "Tamburino" without watermark. (fig.14)


The CORALIT service was interrupted over a great part of its territory between the end of April and the first days of May. Three

Also applied three L28 Lion of San Marco (L64 = to sixth step) tied 'Venezia 21 Mag 45' date stamp. On reverse the boxed handstamp 'Venezia 21 Mag 1945 and that of the Turin agency. At left censor strip and cachet "a ponte 5506".

letters attest that in the first half of May the service continued to function in Piedmont ~ Turin, Novara and Vercelli ~ and from Turin to Milan.

The service was resumed in all localities half way through May and regarding the renewal is a note in a letter from the Provincial Head Office of the Post & Telegraphs at Venice dated 18.5.45 authorising the resumption of the service, headed "Notice", a copy also going to the Allied Censor Central Office in the city. From that moment the CORALIT service operated until 30th June 1945 and in the months of

May and June the CORALIT agencies in the various regions always used the etiquettes of the third issue.

Not many CORALIT letters exist with May or June dates without registration and the relative franking, and in the past because of the


lack of any official documentation of intent, this correspondence was considered to be of philatelic origin. The finding of some letters of this type, genuinely commercial and properly destined for towns where there were CORALIT agencies, some even being examined by the censor, makes us think that there was instead the intervention of an alternative service regulation. (figs. 15, 16 & 17)

5. The third issue of CORALIT etiquettes was followed by a fourth during the last few days of May, comprising a series of five with the same values. This

time Perf. 12, in sheets of 40 and with a new vignette of a courier cycling over the map of northern Italy. (fig.18). These exist also as proofs (?) with the five values in sequence on a series of different colours which we must think to be exclusively a philatelic production. (fig.21)

The use of these perforated etiquettes is known on a number of philatelic items, (the leading example being a complete set on cover, (fig. 19) and in the absence of documentation must be considered doubtful in every case. Those known to us are almost all sent from Turin. (fig. 20)
