

Editorial

FROM THE PRESIDENT

First of all, my thanks to all the members, listed in the Financial Reports, who have paid a subscription for one year. I am sorry that I can only produce 2 issues per year, but it does mean that requests for subscriptions appear to come round quicker! As I cannot guarantee to continue acting as Editor indefinitely, I am reluctant to reintroduce payments for 3 years. I am requesting subscriptions from those whose subscription expires up to March 2014 and this includes a few members who have not paid a subscription for over a year. Only members who have paid an annual subscription will receive the next issue in March 2014. Only 5 or 6 members receive *Bicycle Stamps* by email but if more were to change over it might be possible to revise the subscription rates.

Once again I must thank Thomas Matthies for kindly preparing the New Issue Update for this issue of *Bicycle Stamps 76*. Thomas has also discovered some more information about Théodore Champion and the article is reproduced, but it is written in French. Other members have sent pieces of information and I apologise if any have not been acknowledged. BS 75 included 10 years of Spanish cancellations from Jordi Quintana but I had omitted items on a second page, in error. These are now included together with an unusual Maximum Card from Arnoldt Rehm. Arnoldt also sent me a copy of a souvenir folder for the 1968 Timaru postal service. This is reproduced with an explanation of how it operated.

The 112 page soft covered book entitled *Wyscig Pokoju 1948-1972* has opening chapters in Polish and German but it continues with details of the "Peace Race", listing the route for each Stage; the overall result with the names and nationality of the riders and nations placed first, second and third and illustrations of every stamp, handstamp and illustrated postal cards issued. In this issue, I have scanned and enlarged the special handstamps for the first 10 years of the Race.

To add a little variety, I am including a page of Poster stamps plus some letterheads from Cycle companies at the turn of the 19th and beginning of the 20th century. I hope you enjoy this issue and look forward to hearing from you.

ISSUES OF TAJIKISTAN FROM 2003 AND 2012

29.06.2010 Tajikistan Pre-Olympic Scandal

If someone considers that it is a simple business to design a postage stamp, he deceives himself and others. If an error occurs he will be embarrassed and in the worst situation he could be the cause of a diplomatic scandal.

A stamp issue of Tajikistan in 2003, for the future 28th and 29th Olympic Games in Athens and Beijing, has provided a lesson to those who like to include as much detail on a stamp as possible. The sheet of stamps included images of athletes, various Olympic disciplines, symbols of Greece and China, the dates of the Games, the Olympic flame stylised and an outline of the geographical boundaries of the two countries.

There were no problems apparently with the stamps featuring Greece. However China sent a protest note to Tajikistan about the stamps featuring the Beijing Olympic Games. The territory of Taiwan, "a rebellious province" and one with which China is in a state of "cold war", had not been shown within the outline boundary of China. The words of Jacobean Josephe Fouche are recalled, "It is more than a crime. It is an error."



This inexcusable oversight could have cost Tajikistan political, economic and possibly, military sanctions. How was the State of Tajikistan able to cope with an error by the designers of postage stamps? Tajikistan promised to withdraw the offending postage stamps, but how could they, when some stamps had been sold legitimately and philatelists and Olympic Games' fans had collected examples? "Forgive them, my God, they are silly and do not know what they are doing!" (A citation from the Gospels) This time Tajik's illiteracy had escaped punishment. Is there an object lesson for us?

08.10.2012 Tajikistan. To tease the Dragon

On June 29, 2010 the website "UkraFil" announced the real story of how the bungling officials of the postal department in Dushanbe had almost caused an international incident between the Red Dragon, communistic China, and the



godforsaken feudal state of Tajikistan. A postage stamp issue of Tajikistan shows the geographical outline of China but excludes the territory of Taiwan. Both parties avoided a diplomatic scandal thanks to a silent reconciliation. China, wise in diplomatic matters, followed a Latin maxim "Aquila non captat muscas" (The eagle doesn't catch flies).

However, the strange case of the ill-starred Olympic sheet did not stop there. Instead of carrying out their promise to destroy all existing unsold stamps, the Tajik officials requested the Belrusian printing house to return the remaining specimens of the stamp issue, which included uncut sheets with an additional margin, stored in the printing house warehouse awaiting special orders from the customer. Not being highly paid, the Tajik post office staff wished to earn additional cash by selling the leftover unrecorded material.

Meanwhile, the Chinese management's reaction to this new state of affairs was unknown. Would it overlook the latest development also? However it would encourage some collectors of sports stamps to obtain examples of these "errors".

02.10.2012 Tajikistan.

The performance by athletes from Tajikistan in the Olympic Games in London was unsuccessful. Mavzuna Choriyeva won one bronze medal in female boxing, weight to 60Kg. and the Tajik team was placed last in the list of medallists. The prestige of Muslim sports was rescued not by devout courageous men but by a woman, one of the weak sex, deprived of civil rights.

In September 2012, the state enterprise of Tajikistan, "Markazi Marka", published the memorable postage stamp issue devoted to the participation of the Tajik athletes at the Olympic Games in London. It simply overprinted in blue and black one thousand sheets of each type of the 2003 miniature sheet, devoted to Olympic Games in Athens and Beijing!

13.02.2013 Tajikistan "Gyulchatay, open a face"

On October 2 2012, the website UkraFil had reported the Tajik post's issue devoted to the Olympic Games in London, under the heading "Abdullah's tenth wife". Details were updated in February 2013, as follows.

On the eve of the opening of the Summer Olympic Games in London on July 26, 2012 the Tajikistan Post issued a memorable stamp issue devoted to the Tajik Olympians. Dark blue and black overprints were added to the Olympic Games issue by Tajikistan in 2003. The post officials wanted to be in time for the opening day of the London Olympic Games but the rush by the printers resulted in poor quality of images, rough texts, missing letters and colour transformations.

The black overprint was so bad it was almost impossible to read the Tajik text. To overcome the problem the Dushanbe officials decided not to withdraw the 2,000 miniature sheets but to order a reprint of the Olympic overprints. These were in blue and black colours and the quality of print was acceptable. The new issue appeared on sale at the end of October and as many copies were sold as for the first edition.

Collectors were unhappy with having to identify 2 different versions.

Thomas Matthies forwarded this article to me and I improved the grammar, hopefully! When I queried whether I had made sense of the article he responded

MORE ABOUT THÉODORE CHAMPION

Arnodt Rehm has provided a copy of a French article published in 2008 as a follow up to "Théodore: champion cycliste!" on pages 26 – 28 in BS75 March 2013.

Théodore Champion, cyclisme et philatéliste

Comme nous venons de la voir par notre étude, la philatélie et la bicyclette touchent l'art sous plusieurs aspects puisqu'elle constitue, d'après la définition du Robert, un ensemble de connaissances et de règles d'action, dans un domaine particulier.

Depuis des années et des années la philatélie et tout ce qui gravite autour a développé ses règles, ses normes, ses cotes, ses connaissances dans le but de plaire de plus en plus à ceux qui s'y adonnent ainsi qu'au public en général.

Nous devons ces règles et ces normes à de très grands philatélistes qui nous ont précédés et en terminant cette chronique nous aimerons vous entretenir brièvement de l'un d'eux, Monsieur Théodore Champion. L'illustration 318 pré-

sente le numéro spécial de la revue L'Univers des Timbres soulignant le centenaire de la Maison Théodore Champion tandis que sur l'illustration 319 nous voyons le timbre

qui fut émis en 1969 par le Leichenstein pour honorer les pionniers de la philatélie. Il y figure à côté des timbres du Comte Philippe de Ferrari, Carl Lindenberg et Maurice Burrus.

Nous avons découvert à travers nos recherches que Théodore Champion avant d'être un de ces grands philatélistes qui a marqué l'histoire, fut d'abord un grand cycliste. En effet, afin de mettre en pratique la maxime « Mens sana in corpore; sano », Théodore Champion avait ! choisit le cyclisme pour y parvenir. Le 14 juin 1891, il remportait haut la main une course de 50 kilomètres sur route sur tricycle en 1h 45mn 45s, tout un exploit pour cette époque. En 1894, il devient champion cycliste de Suisse et remporte le Grand Prix de Genève. Si Théodore Champion s'est adonné au cyclisme, il s'est également intéressé au sport en général et plus particulièrement aux courses hippiques et à l'aviation.

Théodore Champion fut un grand passionné de la philatélie tout au long de sa vie. « Fils d'un employé de banque et d'une mère qui collectionnait les timbres-poste, son frère Adrien et lui collectionnent également ces vignettes postales. Ils n'hésitent pas à fouiller les poubelles de la banque paternelle pour récupérer des exemplaires. On raconte qu'ils ont vendu leur collection pour une forte somme pour montrer à leur père sceptique le bien-fondé de leur entreprise ».

Théodore Champion réalisera une collection mondiale quasi-complète couvrant la période de 1840 à 1940 où figuraient la plupart des timbres les plus rares. Il aimait faire connaître ses collections et les présentait dans plusieurs expositions nationales et internationales.

À son arrivée à Paris, il s'associa à un marchand de timbre et dès 1902 il acquiert ce commerce qu'il nommera : Théodore Champion et Compagnie. En 1912 « Théodore Champion et Cie » deviendra la « Maison Théodore Champion » qui au fit des ans se spécialisera dans l'acquisition et la livraison des nouveautés du monde entier.


Ardant promoteur des connaissances philatéliques, Théodore Champion innovera en créant le Bulletin Mensuel Théodore Champion dans lequel il diffusera de l'information sur les nouveautés et promotions mondiales. Nous vous présentons de notre bibliothèque la page couverture du bulletin #573 qui en était à sa 49° année en septembre 1951 (Ill. 320) dans lequel on peut voir en page 11 un timbre cycliste de l'Italie qui commémore le championnat du monde cycliste lors de la Foire de Bari (Ill. 321).

Théodore Champion était reconnu pour son professionnaliste, son travail méticuleux, sa remarquable mémoire et ses grandes compétences en matière d'évaluation des timbres. C'est pour ces raisons que Monsieur Louis Yvert propose à Théodore Champion en 1902 d'effectuer le travail de révisions des cotes de son catalogue, travail qu'il fera pendant 54 ans. THE BERLIN-WARSAW-PRAGUE "PEACE RACE" Brian Sole

In BS 59 May 2007 Tony Howes listed and described the stamps issued for this annual amateur stage race, from the inaugural race in 1948 (which was run as two events; Warsaw to Prague and Prague to Warsaw) to the 40th anniversary in 1987. The first race was held shortly after the end of World War II and was known as the Peace Race because the organisers wanted European cyclists to take part in a spirit of friendship to help overcome the divisions created by War. Tony confirmed that the final Warsaw – Berlin – Prague race was held in 1989, the year of the fall of the Berlin Wall. Although the Peace Race has continued, it has become a minor event in the International calendar and no longer includes the originating cities.

I am showing 2 pages from my own collection with items from the first 9 races followed by some enlarged handstamps.





LOCAL POSTAL SERVICE TIMARU NEW ZEALAND 1968/9

My thanks to Arnoldt Rehm for sending me a copy of a souvenir folder containing the first 2 stamps issued. I have not seen this folder previously. (see below).

In no way can the issue be called attractive but the issue has caused controversy in the past; there is no definite proof that the schoolboys actually delivered mail. This is what Ronald Sudbury had to say about the issue in "Stamp Collecting for the Cyclist", published by Harry Hayes, 1981.


"The Timaru Bicycle Post. A private post operating on the east coast town of Timaru, South Island, New Zealand – about 100 miles from Christchurch – was established in December 1968 by Moulins Services. The object was to deliver mail at lower rates than the N.Z. Post Office.

"Normal postal rates in N.Z. were 3 cents for letters and 18c. for registered mail. The Timaru local post charged 2c. for ordinary and 5c. for registered letters. Mail was delivered by boys on bicycle and reached its destination the same day as posted. Three collecting centres were set up in the town..

"On December 2nd (1968) two stamps were issued to cover the rates; 1cent (inscribed cents on thestamp) black on orange, and 2c. black on deep red. The stamps were crudely typeset, printed by the classic Printing Co. of Timaru and line rouletted 6 ³/₄. Moulins Services stated that a fairly large quantity was printed.

"The stamps were printed singly in sheets and some designs were out of alignment with others as well as overlapping so far as the central line of inscription is concerned. After a time four more values were added, 3c. green on orange, 5c. blue on deep red, 7c. red and black on orange and 15c. gold on deep red. The gold inscriptions on the 15c. were printed by thermography, so that the ink stands up from the paper giving the impression of recess printing. On April 12th 1969, the existence of the local post came to the knowledge of the New Zealand Postmaster-General, as a result of the organisers having applied to him for official recognition, and he ordered its suspension forthwith.




