


- 3. Issues marked * have been corrected or have additional information. The additional or corrected information is underlined.
- Issues marked
 are deemed to be fake, i.e. not stamps only Cinderellas or illegals, therefore they will not have a date of issue
 (Cinderellas are fantasy products. Illegals are unauthorized stamps sometimes with the name of real existing postal authorities
 produced in fraudulent intent).
- Additions to the list are indicated by a heavy solid left-hand border to the country's name box.
 Additions that are not really new, but not mentioned in one of the known Bicycle Stamp catalogues (Batho, Hilarides, Malone, Muhsil, Waltl) marked with a white in the border.
- 6. Issues that appear on this list for over a year are moved to the "Issue Information Update" list.



- 7. Content of set: Meaning of signs and abbreviations
 "→" = published in ... (ex. 2→2Shl(10) = 2 stamps published in 2 sheetlets of 10 each)
- 8. The last column shows where the stamp is illustrated, with BS number, followed by page number.
- 9. If any catalogue entry (Scott, Stanley Gibbons, Michel or Yvert & Tellier) or information from postal authority or official agency is known it is indicated with "{§}" in the same column. If a WNS no. is known it is stated (e.g. "[LR024.09]"). The WNS no. documents, that it is definitely a legal issue.

- 10. Personalized stamps are only listed if they are published by postal administrations or well-known organizations.

CYCLE ADVERT 1934 DANISH BOOKLET (cont.) from Flemming Andreasen

The booklet on p24 of BS79 was issued on 10 May 1943 and contained 8 X 5 Öre red and 16 X 10 Öre violet stamps. The advert was for Rich's coffee! The translation is -"6 nights, 6 days fever, but fresh during the day, thanks to a cup of Rich's coffee." 1934, was the first year that 6-day cycle races were held in Forum, Copenhagen. The bottom right hand corner of the outside back page has the number "41". Flemming described other Danish booklets with a bicycle connection.

1. Issued 20 June 1940 (AFA Special) and 16 December 1941 (Boom). They contain 16 X 5 Öre in red and 16 x 5 Öre stamps in violet. There are several interleaves including one on Rules for Cyclists, which can be compared with the Ten Commandments. These interleaves are mentioned on the Listing by Norman Batho but without any date of issue of the booklet. The "Ten Commandments" for cyclists also appear in other booklets including those issued 26 April 1938 and 6 February 1939. The covers exist in 3 shades.

Issued 7 September 1939 (Boom) and 26 April 1938 (AFA Special). translation of the wording into English is "Down the hills, up the hills, for energy success I thank Success chocolate, the flat breakfast packet".









FIRST DAY COVERS with CYCLE HANDSTAMP in LATROBE TASMANIA

Latrobe has conducted a Cycling Carnival on Christmas and Boxing Days since 1896. "The Latrobe Wheelrace" was begun by the Druids Lodge, then run by Mr J T Lucas the publican, before eventually being taken over in 1928 by the Latrobe Bicycle Race Club. Prize money has totalled Aus\$8,000, with World Champions, Sid Paterson, Russell Mockridge, Reg Harris, Jan Derkson & Danny Clarke taking part over years.




Latrobe Christmas 1980 FDC. Postmark has Tasmania map with racing cyclist.


CENTENARY DISTRICT NURSING SERVICES ISSUED 13 MARCH 1985







BIKES ON TALS

New Zeala de Continue & CALs (or Customized Advarianta Labels) for use by its customizations Businesses, individuals, organizations and government entities purchase these labels from NZ Post for use on their private correspondence. They are valid for New Zealand (NZ) postal use.

Tourism New Zealand ("Tourism") is an organization responsible for marketing NZ as a tourist destination. Tourism is a separate Crown entity funded by the NZ Government. It is the official tourist marketing agency for NZ. There are 80 or so official tourist information centres in NZ known as "iSites".

In 2014, 10 of the iSite regions each issued separate CALs they refer to as "Regional Stamp Booklets". Each regional booklet showed 10 different local tourist attractions for that region. NZ Post designed them. The CALs were initially issued in denominations of NZ\$0.70 and NZ\$1.90. They were reissued later in denominations of NZ\$0.80 and NZ\$2.00, to reflect postal rate increases.

The booklet of the Canterbury Region includes a stamp showing cycling near Lake Pukaki, in the central South Island. The Canterbury booklets show the same 10 tourist related scenes in the four different denominations.



An "interesting" item! The "stamp" is a charity seal from the "Free German Youth" (FDJ = Freie Deutsche Jugend) organization. It was accepted by the regular mail service in 1958. An error, a joke or a fraud – who knows? More similar seals about.

LIECHTENSTEIN POST 1918

The London Stamp Dealer Argyll Etkin is offering for sale the cover below for £2500. The description is as follows

"Cover (flap missing) to Cologne with Vaduz-Sevelen courier Post label perforated on all sides (two short perfs) affixed to lower left corner, uncancelled, with Switzerland 25p Helvetia cancelled by Sevelen, St Gallen c.d.s. (8 November) at top. The cover with Hunziker handstamp on reverse and "Marzer Attest" (Expertisation certificate by Peter Marzer).

An attractive example of this most uncommon franking. The only distinctive stamps used throughout Liechtenstein between 1912 and 1920 were those of the Austrian Post Office in the Principality. With the collapse of Austria, at the end of the First World War, Vaduz, the capital, found itself without a postal service. To bridge the gap, for a few weeks in 1918, the town council rented an Austrian post office box at the nearby town of Sevelen in Switzerland. A local stamp inscribed 'Schweizer Post, Vaduz' costing 10 heller, was required for each item collected or delivered over the border. The service was conducted only by an **agent on a bicycle**."

Ronald Sudbury, in "Stamp Collecting for the Cyclist" published 1981, describes the service in similar terms but more briefly.

"The Schweizer Post Vaduz stamp was issued in 1918 for use on mail sent by the municipal messenger, cycling between Vaduz, the capital of Liechtenstein, and Sevelen, just over the border in Switzerland, where the mail was posted. The need for this service arose following the collapse of Austria at the end of World War I, when the Austrian postal service, which covered Liechtenstein, ceased. The stamp is rare and expensive."

I recall a collector of bicycle stamps found evidence, some years ago, that it was **NOT** true that a messenger delivered the mail by bicycle. Can any member confirm this?

CORALIT (Corrieri Alta Italia)

Extract from an article, dated 13 September 1991, by Paul Lowe of Haslemere, culled from the Italian catalogue *Sassone*. CORALIT was listed under the section "Authorised Private Services". Two illustrations in the catalogue show that normal postage stamps were used to pay the postal rate and that the CORALIT stamps paid for the additional service.

The General Directorate of the (Italian) Ministry of Communications authorised CORALIT to institute a postal service by means of "cyclist couriers" in an official letter dated 26 February 1945. The route was prescribed as Beramo-Brescia-Ferrara-Milan-Novara-Rovigo-Turin-Trieste-Vercelli. This authorisation was suspended at the end of April 1945 and renewed in an official communication of the Provincial Directorate of Venice on 21 May 1945. It also included the Approval of the Allied Military Government.

In addition to the normal postal rate of one lira for every 15 grams CORALIT charged 14 Lire for every ten-gram weight. Following the first authorisation, two stamps were issued – imperf. and ungummed, with the values of 14 Lire and 28 Lire, but the 28 Lire stamp was never used. After the renewal of the authorisation two sets were issued with values in multiples of 14 Lire. The firm *SARIG* of Turin printed the stamps from designs by Ferruccio Grassi.

The CORALIT postal service ended on 30 June 1945 when the Allied Military Government established a regular postal service in Northern Italy.

14 Lire carmine and design, St Mark's Venice Lion. (103,000 issued)

28 Lire olive-green and design as above. (104,000 issued)

56 Lire lilac and design as above. (22,350 issued)

70 Lire light brown and design Cycle wheel on Map. (17,400 issued)

140 Lire bluish grey and design Cycle wheel on Map. (11,850 issued)

Issued May 1945 in sheets of 50 (10 X 5) on buff paper imperf.

Third set

5 values, as for 2^{nd} set, the design – cyclist on a Map - is the same on all values - in sheets of 40 (4 X 10) on buff paper and perforated.



The imprint shown was also available as one of 2 individual values, 2pf and 3Pf, described as 'Berliner Verkehrsanstalt "Hansa" (1)', issued 1886 and illustrated in Glasewald's Private Postmark Catalogue.


This question needs an answer before we consider putting new issues onto the website and I would need to consult with Thomas Matthies to obtain his views before proceeding further.)

NY 2016 INTERNATIONAL PHILATELIC EXHIBITION NEW YORK USA.


