Editorial

It is my pleasure to announce that our Vice-President, Jary Majander, has agreed to become our Honorary Life President. Jari has produced a Large Gold Cycling exhibit and actively supports the Finnish Philatelic Federation in thematic philately and also acts as a Commissioner for Finland, and as an International Judge, for the FIP. Welcome, Jari.

Enclosed with this issue you should receive Bicycle Stamps Club Membership Cards for 2015 and 2016. Having prepared the 2015 cards early, I filed them away so safely that it took almost a year to find them again! Jordi Quintana was kind enough to suggest an unusually shaped postcard from Spain as our 2016 Membership Card. The card is part of a Europe wide promotion of the Green effect. The bicycle is very good for the environment because it does not produce obnoxious fumes, unlike the motorcar for example.

The main contributors to this issue are Thomas Matthies, assisted by Piet-Hein Hilarides, and Arnoldt Rehm. My thanks to Thomas and Piet-Hien for producing the New Issues Update, once again. It was not possible to include in BS81 all contributions sent by Arnoldt and I have tried to make up for this in BS82. He raises the question why should we collect the early German local stamps, with a bicycle shown, simply because the service is provided by postmen on bicycles. What do you think? Do let me know. Arnoldt has also confirmed that a postal service operated from Liechtenstein to Switzerland in 1918 was not operated by a bicycle messenger but by horse and cart, as shown in the photograph reproduced. He also raised a question about Italian poster stamps illustrated in BS 77 and provided an article on a revenue stamp placed on a pack of playing cards with bicycles on the backs, in 1894. Finally, Arnoldt is laying claim to finding the oldest philatelic item connected with cycling, from 1869. Can anybody beat that? I cannot.

If this issue is a little late, it is because I spent too much time watching the Rio de Janeiro Olympic Games and cheering the efforts of the G. B. Cyclists. I have scanned newspaper photographs and inserted the copies with philatelic items produced for the 2012 Olympic Games in London, when Royal Mail issued a stamp for every British Gold Medal.

The next issue will be March 2017. Do check if renewal is due and send your remittance to me, or to Steven Andreasen, the US Treasurer, promptly. Enjoy your collecting!


MEMBERSHIP CARDS BICYCLE STAMPS CLUB 2015 and 2016. Brian Sole

The mystery of the 2015 BSC Membership Card.

On 27 June 2015, the Island of Jersey in the Channel Islands issued a set of 14 stamps on the opening day of the Nat West Island Games XVI. Jersey was hosting these Games, which were managed by the International Islands Games Association (IIGA) set up in 1985 and has 25 members. The 2015 theme was "Bringing Islands together" enforcing the concept of bringing together islands from different parts of the world in a friendly competition. The set of stamps, each valid for the postcard rate, included one with a group of racing cyclists on the road.

I purchased about 60 of these stamps and attached them to a batch of postcards, each with a different racing cyclist illustrated on the front. I sent the cards back to Jersey with a request to apply the first day of issue cancellation, anticipating a special handstamp. Although the cards were cancelled 27 June 2015 as requested, the cancellation was the standard double ring cancellation used on everyday mail. I proceeded to add address labels, one per BSC member, and a second label "Bicycle Stamps Club Membership 2015". I then filed the cards safely, ready for despatch with the September issue of "Bicycle Stamps". However, when the September issue of our journal was ready for despatch I could not find the Membership cards, despite an extensive search! When the March 2016 issue of "Bicycle Stamps" was ready I still had not found these cards, until a month ago. I wanted a file, which I knew was in a particular cabinet. I did find the file and also came across the missing postcards, hidden between two taller files. Hopefully, your 2015 membership card is enclosed!


JERSEY Island Games XVI FDC 27 Jun 15 (reduced). Cycling bottom right.

I became aware quite early of a "Green" Guernsey stamp, featuring a cyclist, and soon discovered that most European countries were issuing a stamp with a similar design. Jordi contacted me by email and attached a scan of a Spanish postcard in the shape of a leaf, with the "Green" cyclist stamp pre-printed on the address side. It was rather unusual but I agreed that we could use the card as our 2016 Membership Card. Jordi kindly obtained 50 cards for me, pre-cancelled, and I have adapted the cards as I had done last year, but using green ink. I hope you will like your copy!

A QUESTION FROM ARNOLDT REHM

"Why should we collect stamps which do not show a bicycle or have a remark about cycling? For example the German local post Hamburg – see attachment. (This appeared to be copied from Le Cycle et la Poste by Jean-Pierre Mangin and René Geslin headed "Etats Allemands Postes Locales". Only 2 out of 15 show cycles) Arnoldt continued, "On the other hand the "Deutsch Post" has ten thousands of bicycle messengers. My complete mail (including the club magazine) is delivered by bicycle to my home, but this is no reason for me to look at this mail or the issues of "Deutsch Post" as bicycle items"


Response from the Editor, but other comments welcome.

My first check list of Bicycle Stamps was "The Bicycle and the Postage Stamp" by Ronald F Sudbury, 1976 and the later edition "Stamp Collecting for the Cyclist" by Ronald F Sudbury, 1981. Both editions recorded the earliest bicycle issues as-

- 6 local stamps by Germany Bochum in 1887 showing a postman riding an Ordinary Bicycle;
- a single local stamp by Frankfurt-on-Main in August 1887 to commemorate the 4th convention of the German Cyclists' Federation and
- a single stamp showing a tricycle from a set of stamps depicting various forms of transport in March 1988.

These are local posts, which ceased on 1 April 1900 but can be included in any bicycle stamps collection. (See next page, copied from my cycle collection.)

The illustrations of the Hamburg non-cycle stamps is explained in the earlier subchapter of "Le Cycle et la Poste", under the (translated) heading "The Local German stamps from 1886 to 1900". The authors are postal historians who had delved into the background of the local stamp issues by Hamburg from 1886. There is evidence that they consulted *Glasewald Privatpostmarken Katalog*, 1953, which lists dozens of local German mail services with many illustrations of the stamps used. The local stamps of Hamburg, and others, were included in "Le Cycle et la Poste", either because of the issue of a cycle stamp or because photographs were found showing postmen with their bicycles outside the main office from which the postal service operated. As mentioned above, these local postal services continued, with the approval of the government post until 1 April 1900, when they had to close.



WORLD STAMP SHOW NEW YORK 2016 Sat 28 May - Sat 4 June 2016

Opinions as to the success of this large Philatelic Exhibition varied. Wade Saadi, President of the Show, has written an open letter to the Philatelic Community in which he reports receiving hundreds of emails from visitors congratulating the show committee on a spectacular show. "It was a once-in-a-lifetime experience for many and truly appreciated by everyone". He does conclude by saying "The biggest challenge awaits us. How do we capitalise on this great event for the good of philately's future? Every one of us should be working on that now". The full text of his letter is available at http://stamp/.cm/ny-letter

Visitors were greeted by a 100-year-old Curtiss Jenny JN-4H plane, which had been dismantled, transported to New York and rebuilt especially for the event. There were seven stamp releases of USA stamps during the show and visitors were encouraged to collect cachets from most stands in a special show passport. The world's most expensive stamp, the 1c Black on Magenta British Guiana, 1856, was on display, in addition to over 4,000 frames of philatelic material.

Richard West, who had spoken to many people who had attended the show, painted a different picture in *Stamp Magazine*. The venue, the Javits Center, was vast and impressive but expensive to hire. The organisers declined to hire the public address system, which would have cost \$27,000. This prevented the advertising of talks, seminars etc to the daily visitors. There were 200 dealers but not all stands were sold. The philatelic passports attracted few buyers and the vast number of frames of competitive philately lacked onlookers, apparently. The organisers had anticipated a total attendance of 250,000, whereas the actual figure was around 40,000.

Steven Andreasen and Bill Eubanks met up during the show but I have not heard from any other BSC member who attended the show. Results of the competitive bicycle exhibits were as follows.

Frames 4318-4325 "My Life as a Bicycle" by Vojtech Jankovic, Slovakia "An autobiographical story of a bicycle's life through its curriculum vitae in four stages, personal data, professional record, professional experience and hobbies" 94 marks - Gold award and a Special Prize for Knowledge.

Frames 4607 –4614 "Go by cycle!" by Brian Sole, U.K.

"A crude invention by Karl von Drais in 1818 led to the start of the cycling industry, cycle racing and utilitarian cycling." 89 marks - Large Vermeil award.





USPC Bicycle Design Patent


With the passage of the Wilson-Gorman Tariff Act, the BEP also produced a 2¢ rouletted 5½, ultramarine stamp that was sold only to playing card manufacturers. The unwatermarked stamp had a similar design as the previous lake stamp but replaced "ON HAND" with "ACT OF." These stamps were first distributed on August 30, 1894.

The United States Playing Card Company applied three unique types of cancels on the 1894 stamps. The type-1 cancel was a preprinted **script** U.S.P.C.Co. with the month (Sept., Oct., Nov., or Dec.) and the year (1894) running from the lower left to upper right corners.



U.S.A. SPECIAL DELIVERY 10c. Series 1902 Overprinted PHILIPPINES

The following two lots from "The Robert Markovits Collection of Special Delivery" were auctioned by Schuyler Rumsey Auctions in New York on 1 June 2016.



Lot 1206 described as Philippines Special Delivery 10c Bureau of Insular Affairs Special Printing, beautifully centered with bright colour, own gum ScottE2a E \$2750



Lot 1207 was a plate block of 8 of the same stamp, described as follows. In the summer of 1907, at the request of the Bureau of Insular Affairs, the issue of 1903-1904 was specially printed on very white paper. Bob Markovits' original research indicated that two panes of 50 of this stamp were originally overprinted on plate 1774. Both bottom plates exist but this plate block of eight is not only the largest known plate block, but the largest known multiple of this issue. Five blocks of four are recorded as well as the other bottom plate of six. It is believed that the top portion of each of the two panes were never broken and disappeared so that no more than a total of 16 singles, five blocks of four and the plate blocks of six and eight for a total of 50 stamps existing. This plate block also shows the damaged "N" variety in the word "cent". Since this issue was provided for exhibition purposes, probably for the Queen of Italy, no used examples are known. Both known plate blocks were acquired by J Murray Bartels and sold to Economist Stamp Company prior to November 1917, when both were sold to one of the earliest Special Delivery collectors, W Parsons Todd, long time mayor of Morristown New Jersey. Bob Markovits acquired this plate block from the Todd auction in 1978.

Re Liechtenstein Local Post by Bicycle Sevelen Switzerland 1918

On pages 22/23 of BS 80 a cover offered for sale at £2,500 by Argyll Etkin was illustrated showing a perforated stamp in the bottom left hand corner with the words "Schweizer Post Vaduz" on a plain background. The description offered by Argyl Etkin ended "The service was conducted only by an agent on a bicycle". I ended the article by suggesting that the service was not conducted by a messenger on a bicycle and requested comments by readers.




ABOVE: An enlarged scan, from flap, of lady on tricycle.

Re Battaglione Lombardo Volontari Ciclisti - World War I

Good morning Brian

In BS 77 page 36 (back cover) you discussed the colour of the Italian poster stamps mentioned above. Attached you find a scan showing some of them in the colours red

dark brown green

grey-blue violet



Does the grey-blue fit the blue of your sheet? The dark brown is nearly black. This may explain the assumption that black also exists.
Arnoldt.

I gave a rather hurried answer at the time, but having found a similar grey card to the one scanned by Arnoldt, I can now confirm that the grey-blue colour does match the grey-blue colour of my full sheet of the 10 poster stamps.

As Charles Kiddle obtained mint sheets of the 10 labels in the separate colours of brown, green and violet, I suggest that sheets of red must have been printed also. However, I cannot see any reason for a sheet to have been printed in black (except perhaps as a proof).

The stamps attached to the grey card, illustrated below, headed "Battaglione Lombardo Volontari Ciclisti" consist of one large and one small label in 5 different colours. Therefore each card must have been made up of stamps from 5 different sheets. The stamps on Arnoldt's card are neatly cancelled by a circular cancellation, which is not legible from the scan.

My card contains mint stamps and sadly has one large red stamp missing. On the back there is a double circular cancellation with the following words between the two circles "BATT* LOMB * VOLON*CICLISTI". Brian Sole
