

CENTENARY of the CYCLE INDUSTRY 1869-1969

The Cycle industry in Coventry began when a "Michaux" velocipede from Paris was shown to the COVENTRY SEWING MACHINE COMPANY by Mr ROWLEY TURNER in November 1868. The company changed its name to the COVENTRY MACHINE CO. and produced its first replicas of the French machine in February 1869.

These velocipedes, soon known as "Boneshakers", were of wooden construction with coach built wheels, shod with iron tyres. The brake was manipulated by a twist grid control which wound a cord round the handlebar. The cord was attached to an iron stirrup brake which operated on the rear wheel. The firm became the "SWIFT". Within 10 years there were 15 other manufacturers of cycles in Coventry

Thomas Matthies has discovered that a German cycle dealer used to print adverts for his company on the back of the German postage stamps he used, prior to the use of 'perfins'. Other articles of a historical nature include illustrations of stamps and postmarks referring to the formation of Cycling Clubs in Germany, Italy, France, Belgium and Great Britain. The series of GB cycling slogans, begun in the previous issue, continues. An Index with one line entries has been created and the 2nd batch of slogans are mainly limited to the actual marks and do not include a large part of the envelope. The list will be extended. I hope everybody will find something of interest. More articles will be very welcome!

- Issues marked
 are deemed to be fake, i.e. not stamps only Cinderellas or illegals, therefore they will not have a date of issue (Cinderellas are fantasy products. Illegals are unauthorized stamps sometimes with the name of real existing postal authorities produced in fraudulent intent).
- 6. Additions to the list are indicated by a heavy solid left-hand border to the country's name box. Additions that are not really new, but not mentioned in one of the known Bicycle Stamp catalogues (Batho, Hilarides, Malone, Muhsil, Waltl) marked with a white in the border.
- 7. Issues that appear on this list for over a year are moved to the "Issue Information Update" list.
- 8. Content of set: Meaning of signs and abbreviations
 "→" = published in ... (ex. 2→2Shl(10) = 2 stamps published in 2 sheetlets of 10 each)
- The last column shows where the stamp is illustrated, with BS number, followed by page number.
- 10. If any catalogue entry (Scott, Stanley Gibbons, Michel or Yvert & Tellier) or information from postal authority or official agency is known it is indicated with "{§}" in the same column. If a WNS no. is known it is stated (e.g. "[LR024.09]"). The WNS no. documents, that it is definitely a legal issue.

11. Personalized stamps are only listed if they are published by postal administrations or well-known organizations.

* Why isn't it a stamp? What is the definition of a stamp?

Linn's: An officially issued postage label, often adhesive, attesting that payment has been rendered for mail delivery. Wiktionary: A small piece of printed paper stuck on an item to be mailed, indicating that postage has been paid. In this case the postage isn't paid. The barcodes are personalized and the payment will be at the end of a period, depended on the case of usage. It can be used for cards, letters, registered letter etc. Up to now I don't now an exactly term for it. This system was also tested by Deutsche Post in 2010/2011 called EasyFranking. The study group " Privatpost-Merkur im BDPh e.V." has not given a number to this item!


Draaibrug Dedemsvaart

150th ANNIVERSARY of CYCLING COMPETITION J

On May 31, 2018, the Cuban Post put into circulation in Matanzas, a special cancellation celebrating the 150th anniversary of the first cycling race.

The first official track cycle race took place in France on May 31, 1868, in the park of Saint-Cloud (south-west of Paris) covering a distance of 1,200 metres.

With a winning time of 3 minutes and 50 seconds, the British veterinary doctor James Moore (1849-1935) was declared winner of this race and he was given a medal with the effigy of Napoleon III.

This competition was organised a few years after the creation of the velocipede by the Michaux brothers in 1861. James Moore was living in France and was a friend of Ernest Michaux, who had taught him to ride a velocipede.

James Moore went on to win the first Cycle Road Race, organised on November 7, 1869 between Paris and Rouen over a distance of 123 kilometres in 10 hours 25 minutes.

There were 323 entries and about 100 starters, including at least four women riders, who in France were allowed to compete against men and were willing to do so. All kinds of machines were entered, monocycles, bicycles, tricycles and quadricycles. James Moore had achieved an average speed of about twelve kilometres per hour. All the leading places were won by riders of the two-wheeled velocipede, proving its superiority over all other types of machine.



NEW ZEALAND CYCLE TRAILS



Famous bike racers and bike races are often recognised on stamps. Less frequently recognised are bike trails.

Starting in 2008, and in part to create jobs and spur economic growth in the country, New Zealand began investing in the creation of new and updated bike trails. These efforts have resulted in the creation of a portfolio of "Great Rides" cycling trails, showcasing the very best of New Zealand landscape, environment, culture and heritage. There are currently 22 "Great Rides" covering a total of 2,500 kilometres. In 2015, there were a total of 1.3 million riders on the "Great Rides" trails.

On 7 February 2018, New Zealand issued a set of six commemorative stamps highlighting six of the trails. Alps to Oceans; Mountains to Sea; Otago Central Rail Trail; Old Ghost Road; Queen Charlotte Tract and Timber Trail. Those trails differ in nature, some are hut to hut single track routes, while others follow paths which once were once railway lines or horse trails. There are lots of biking opportunities to be had in New Zealand! In addition to the set of gummed stamps, a single miniature sheet containing the six stamps is also available.

Thomas Matthies has discovered that around 1912, August Stuckenbrok protected his postage stamps by having inscribed on the back the wording shown below, which, translated by Thomas reads, "Property of Deutschland Fahradwerke August Stuckenbrock Eibech Largest bicycle house in Germany". These imprints on the back of postage stamps preceded the use of perfins.

















ARTHUR CONAN DOYLE RECOMMENDED A CYCLE RIDE from JORDI QUINTANA

When the spirits are low, when the day appears dark, when work becomes monotonous, when hope hardly seems worth having, just mount a bicycle, go out for a spin down the road, without thought on anything but the ride you are taking', Arthur Conan Doyle(1859-1930) Sherlock Holmes' creator.


Sherlock Holmes demonstrated knowledge of bicycle tyres in "The Return of Sherlock Holmes" and "The Adventure of the Priory School" in Issue No.158, Feb. 1904 of the *Strand Magazine*. The 10 year old son of the Duke of Holderness escapes overnight from the Priory School and is kidnapped. On the same night the German master Heidegger also disappeared, taking his bicycle with him. Holmes and Dr Watson find a pathway in the middle of which "clearly marked in the sodden soil was the track of a bicycle". Watson cheers but Holmes says "A bicycle certainly but not the bicycle I am familiar with forty-two impressions left by tyres. This, as you percieve is a Dunlop, with a patch upon the outer cover. Heideggar's tyres were Palmer's leaving longitudinal stripes, Aveling, the mathematical master was sure of that. Therefor it is not Heidegger's track."

The CYCLISTS' TOURING CLUB FOUNDED 1878 The Early Days.

Stanley J A Cotterell was responsible for organising the meeting of about 50 cyclists in Harrogate Yorkshire on 5 August 1878. It was agreed unanimously to form "The Bicycle Touring Club", the first Touring Club in the world. The annual subscription was fixed at 2s 6d (current day 12 ½p.) and the objects "to promote touring by bicycle; to help tourists to secure companions and to protect its members". Stanley Cotterell was elected the first Hon. Secretary and S H Ineson the Hon. Treasurer. Regional Consuls were appointed to provide information to members on roads, hotels, and places of interest, on request. The optional Club Uniform was "a dark green Devonshire serge jacket, knickerbockers, Stanley helmet with small peaks and stockings.

A monthly "Circular" (the forerunner of the CTC Gazette) was produced by Stanley Cotterell from October 1878. Membership cards, badges, road routes and maps were also introduced followed by a Club Handbook from July 1879, with addresses of Consuls, hotels and cycle repairer. The Club negotiated a reduction in railway fares for carrying bicycles; the erection of warning signs on steep or dangerous hills and obtained permission for cyclists to be allowed to cycle though Public Parks in London, commencing with Richmond Park and Green Park.

In 1883 the name was changed to "The Cyclists' Touring Club" due to the rising popularity of tricycles. The change was agreed by a postal vote of all members.

This involved a change of badge, but not until 1886, from a shield with the words "Bicycle Touring Club", to the "winged wheel" and the letters "CTC".


In the 1880s the bicycle attracted hostility from drivers of carts and other horse drawn vehicles who claimed that cyclists frightened their horses. The Club often became actively involved in defending members. Local government bodies had powers to resist and hamper the movements of cyclists as they thought fit. In 1887 the CTC became incorporated and gained a legal standing in the courts. It could issue writs and strengthened the Club's ability to protect members' rights. In 1888 the Club was instrumental in getting a local government bill amended by a clause confirming the status of the cycle as a 'carriage' and subject to the laws applying to other carriages. It removed from the statutes those laws which had empowered local bodies to single out cyclists for repressive measures.

1895 to 1899 were boom years for cycling and the CTC. The invention of the Rover Safety in 1885 and Dunlop's pneumatic tyre in 1899 enabled ordinary people to travel around for pleasure or business and it was also good for exercise.. The new Safety bicycle brought about the start of womens' liberation by encouraging women to discard formal clothes in favour of more sensible garb worn by men on bicycles.


In 1894 the Council agreed to the formation of a Northumberland and Durham District Association (DA) and by 1899 fourteen DAs had been set up. This was the beginning of a decentralisation movement

Membership increased rapidly at the beginning and reached 22,000 by 1886 but had declined to 14,000 by 1894 before rising again to 60,500 by 1899, mainly due to the invention of the safety bicycle.

Original Bicycle Touring Club Badge and CTC Badge from 1886





